Tips for Productive Working from Home

- Start and end your workday on purpose
- Eat and drink regularly and healthily
- Work regular breaks into your routine
 - "50+10" minute rhythm
 - Schedule longer breaks (2@30 minutes each) and Lunches (60 minutes)
- Create a workspace that works for you
- Make sure you have the equipment and supplies you need
- Connect with co-workers for business and social conversations
- Plan tomorrow at the end of today
- Reach out when you need help and support

Tips for Managing Remote Employees

- Follow the "Tips for Productive Working from Home"
- Make sure your people have the tools they need
- Plan more carefully than ever with detailed weekly plans
- Do a daily team check-ins to ensure alignment
- Use a team messaging system and keep it running all day
- Offer virtual team work sessions
- Create a new culture
- Foster Solidarity and Inclusion
- Reset expectations and allow a new work rhythm to emerge
- Make incremental changes for remote work as a permanent option

Lack of In-Person Supervision

Challenges:

- Current Management Systems & Controls Often Require in-person interaction
- Informal Meeting Structure & Organizational Processes are ineffective
- Loss of Focus on Individual Management

- Review Each Department & Establish Weekly/Daily Meeting Structure
- Use Forms, Checklists, & Formatted Meeting Minutes to Ensure Required Items are Discussed and Transparent
- Review an Organizational Chart, Document Management Controls and Distribute to Managers & Front-Line Employees
- Establish One-on-one meetings between supervisors & front-line employees. Require that these check-ins are documented.





Distribution of information

Challenges:

- Difficulty in Keeping Entire Organization Systematically Informed
- Avoiding Redundant Communication while Overcommunicating

- Requiring Weekly Individual Check-ins will ensure miscommunication is avoided
- Form a Small Task Team to Disseminate Company Information
- Communicate Swiftly and Cohesively.
- Do your Ground-Work, Communicate with Your Managers!
- Provide Regularly Scheduled Company Wide Updates (even when there is no update)
- Make these updates interactive and use video conferencing when available





Increased distractions & decreased productivity

Challenges:

- Engaging Employees in Value-Add Activities
- Maintaining Focus amidst at home distractions
- Holding Employees Accountable to Productivity Expectations

- Focus on Employee Development & Training Programs
- Engage Employees in Special Projects & Company Initiatives
- Utilize Increased Reporting for Daily Goal Setting & Task Management
- Set Higher Expectations for Systems Responsibilities.
- Reinforce Company Schedules & Daily Rituals (Company Wide),
 Allow for Communicated Flexibility (Individually)





Social isolation & motivating your people

Challenges:

- Lack of In-person Social Interaction
- Managing Individual Stress, Anxiety, and Fear
- Maintaining a Highly Cohesive Team
- Maintaining Employee Retention & Loyalty

- Engage in Social Team-Building Exercises
- Understand & Practice Your Understanding of What is Happening "Off Screen"
- Establish Employee Appreciation Programs that Support Current Personal Challenges
- Support Key Personnel and Supervisory Managers through Training on topics such as Emotional Intelligence and Sensitivity
- Provide Key Personnel and Supervisory Managers with a defined escalation path as issues arise.
- Communicate internal (and external) resources for employees





Best practices for holding remote meetings:

- Establish Ground Rules & Group Norms
 - **Examples** define roles & responsibilities / should we be conducting other work while in the meeting? / do we require video conferencing?
- Test technology beforehand & ask others to enter roughly 5 minutes prior to beginning of meeting
- Fill in "Watercooler Talk" with casual conversation prior to beginning meeting. <u>Do not just jump into the agenda.</u>
- Increase communication touch points through structured meeting follow-up
- Rely on a proactive structure for meeting regularity and abandon a reactive structure

Productivity — Teleworkers are an average of **35-40%** more productive than their office counterparts and have measured an output increase of at least **4.4%**.



Performance — With stronger autonomy via location independence, workers produce results with **40%** fewer quality defects.



Engagement — Higher productivity and performance combine to create stronger engagement, or in other words, **41%** lower absenteeism.



Retention — 54% of employees say they would change jobs for one that offered them more flexibility, which results in an average of 12% turnover reduction after a remote work agreement is offered.



Profitability — Organizations save an average of \$11,000 per year per part-time telecommuter, or 21% higher profitability.

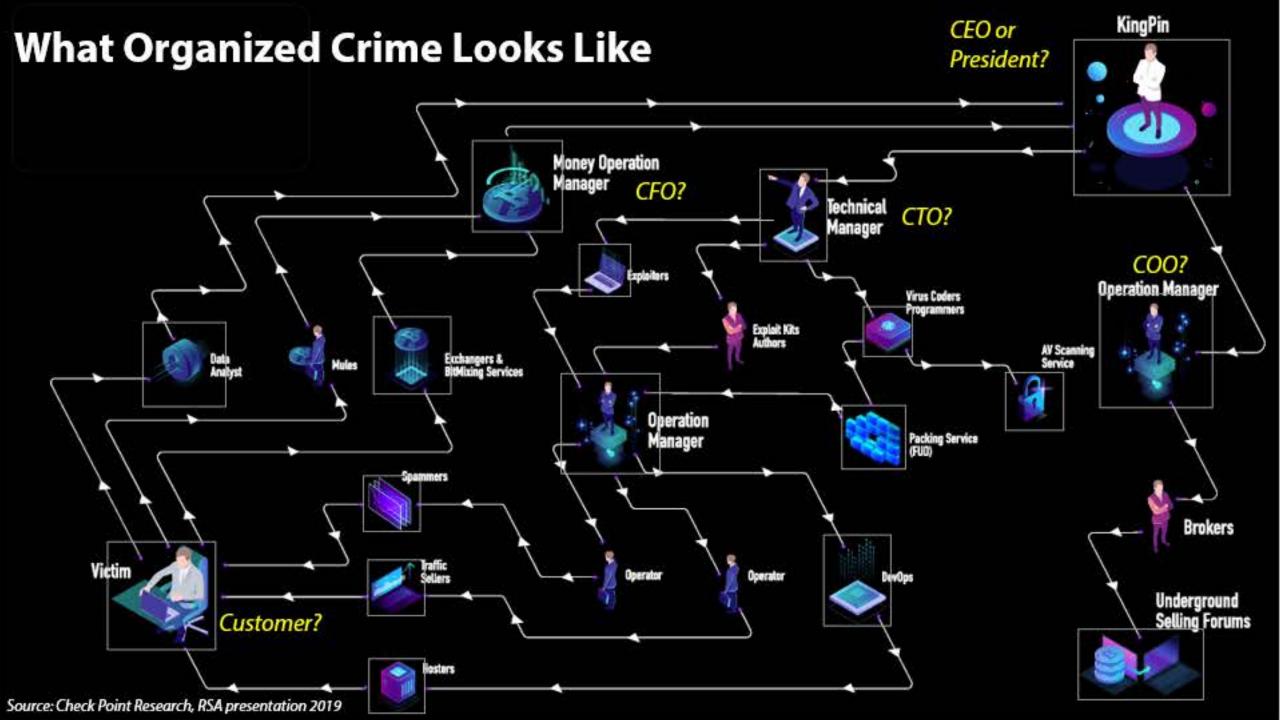

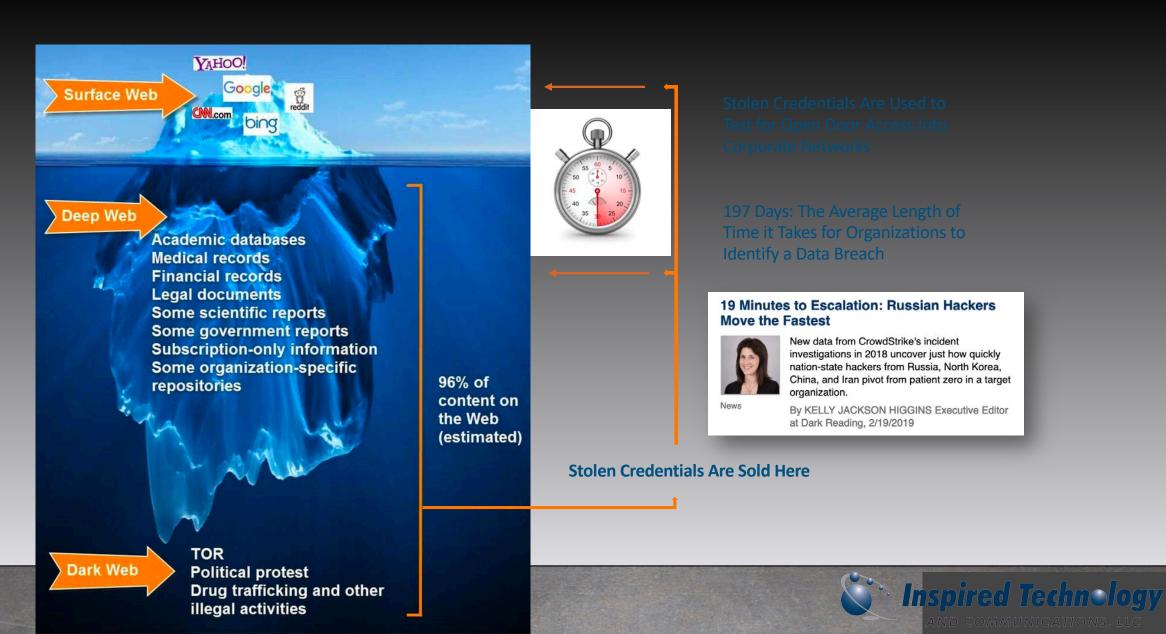

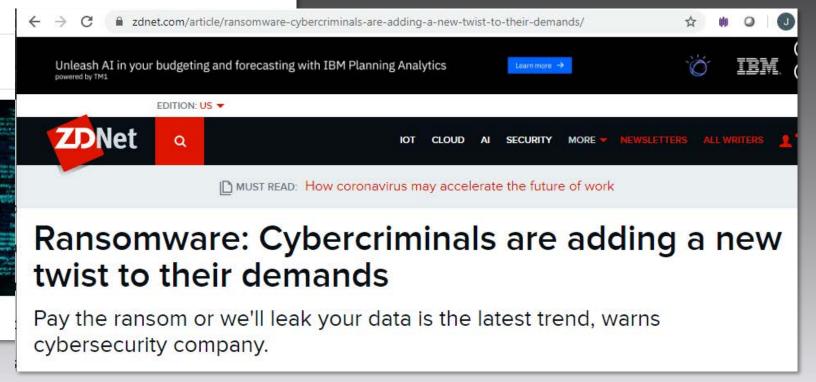

Ransomware Attacks Costs Nearly Triple in 2019 to over \$36K Per Attack

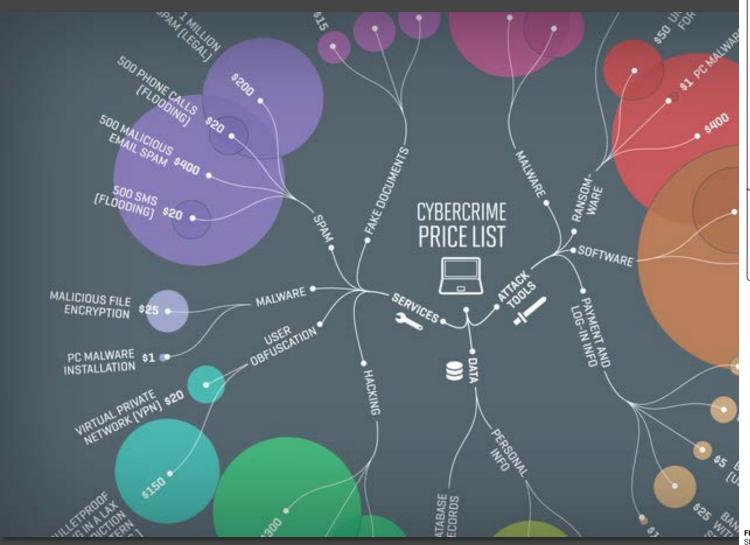


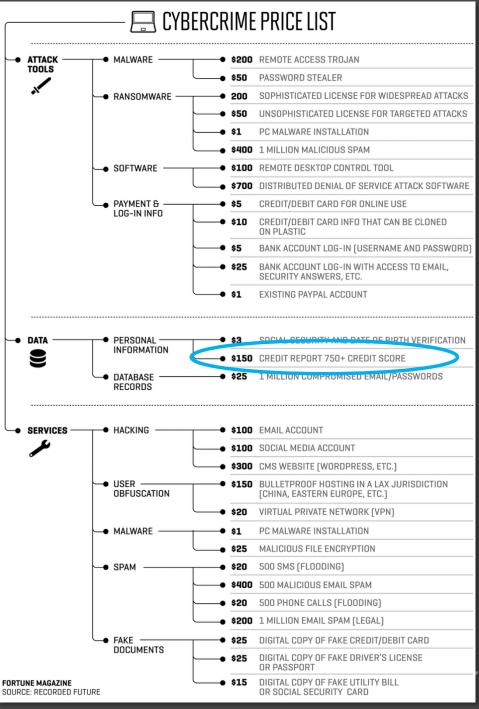

 - Host a trivia game TriviaMaker.com

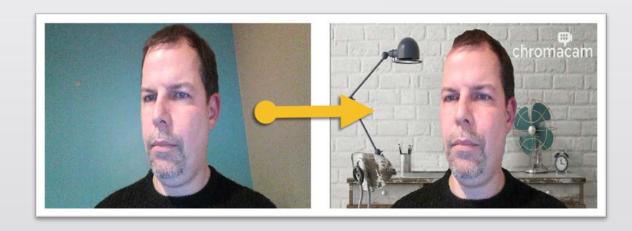


HOW TO LOOK AND SOUND YOUR BEST!
