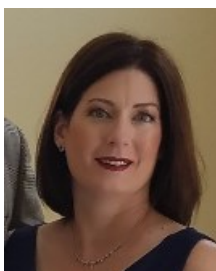


Welcome New Special Education and Student Services Staff!

Kristen Eiser, Nash Elementary

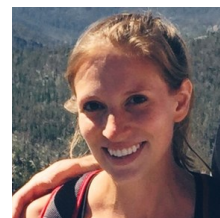

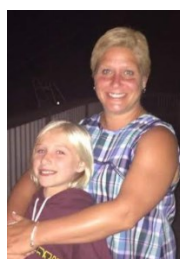


Emily Bates, Walton Farm Elementary
