Situation Summary:	At approximately 3:44 p.m. a full ground and air fire response was dispatched to the South Fork of the Mokulumne River for vegetation fire burning at a dangerous rate of spread up the drainage moving in a southerly direction. Steep and rugged terrain is making access difficult by ground but firefighters are making access. Air resources are dropping retardant in efforts to slow the spread.
