Credit Courses

The following courses meet the NPX standard for high school credit or middle school promotion, but may also be taken for remediation and reinforcing skills and concepts. These courses can help transferring students align with the NPX curriculum, and returning students to complete missed credit. <u>These courses are not intended to substitute for future curricular coursework.</u>

Course	Description	Schedule	Fee
PRE-ALGEBRA (MS)	What it Covers: Computational and number sense skills of calculation necessary for the completion of Pre-Algebra and Intermediate Algebra. This course will be differentiated to suit the needs of each student and will use Khan Academy to help reinforce the skills. Who it's For: incoming 7 th graders who did not pass Pre-algebra or incoming 8 th graders who did not pass Intermediate Algebra	June 1 – 25 (Mon-Thur)	\$325
LATIN I (MS)	What it Covers: Preliminary skills needed to learn Latin, vocabulary, and declensions Who it's For: incoming 7 th grade students who did not pass 6 th grade Latin and new 7 th and 8 th graders	June 1 – 25 (Mon-Thur)	\$250
LATIN II (MS)	What it Covers: Advanced middle school skills needed for Latin, including translation Who it's For: incoming 8 th graders who did not pass 7 th grade Latin	June 1 – 25 (Mon-Thur)	\$250
COMP CAMP (MS)	What it Covers: Advanced middle school skills of reading, writing, and speaking, with a focus on the writing curriculum at NPX Who it's For: incoming 8 th graders who did not pass 7 th grade Lit/comp, incoming 9 th and 10 th graders who need extra writing support and new 9 th and 10 th graders	June 1 – 25 (Mon-Thur)	\$250

ALGEBRA I (HS)	What it Covers: Methods of algebraic thinking that the process and practice of the Exeter Curriculum. This course satisfies the AZ state credit requirement for Algebra I. Who it's For: Incoming 9 th and 10 th graders who do not have an Algebra credit, incoming 9 th graders who did not pass Algebra I	June 1 – 25 (Mon-Thur)	\$325
BIOLOGY (HS)	What it covers: This course will explore an understanding of the minute components which make life possible. Some of the topics that will be discussed include chemical compounds, cellular organelles, cell division and exploring the diversity of physiological adaptations through the examination of many different plants and animals. Who it's For: Incoming HS students who do not have a Biology credit, returning HS students who did not pass one or both semesters of Biology *this course satisfies NPX and AZ graduation requirements	June 1 – 25 (Mon-Thur)	\$325
GEOMETRY (HS)	What it Covers: A study of Euclid's elements while working through Exeter's Mathematics 2 and 3. Who it's For: Incoming 10 th -12 th HS students who do not have a Geometry credit, returning HS students who did not pass one or both semesters of Geometry *this course satisfies NPX and AZ graduation requirements	June 1 – 25 (Mon-Thur)	\$325
US/AMERICAN HISTORY (HS)	What it covers: This course will investigate the question of "What is an American?" in a series of discussions on founding documents, speeches, poems and songs from the founders to Martin Luther King. Special emphasis will be put on understanding the regime outlined by the Constitution and Bill of Rights, and the debates over the meaning and extent of democracy, federalism and equality in American history Who it's For: Incoming 10 th -12 th HS students who do not have a US/American History credit, returning HS students who did not pass one or both semesters of US/American History *this course satisfies NPX and AZ graduation requirements	June 1 – 25 (Mon-Thur)	\$325

ALGEBRA 2/ TRIGONOMETRY (HS)	What it Covers: A study of Algebraic Functions and Trigonometry while Exeter's Mathematics 4 -5. Who it's For: Incoming 12 th and 11 th graders who do not have an Algebra 2 credit, incoming 11 th graders who did not pass Algebra 2.	June 1 – 25 (Mon-Thur)	\$325
ECONOMICS (HS)	What it covers: Who it's for: Incoming 10 th -12 th HS students and/or students who failed economics.	June 1 – 25 (Mon-Thur)	\$325

7th Grade Prep for Prep

We are pleased to offer a series of lively, engaging courses designed to help prepare students to start prep classes in 7th grade, taught by prep faculty. These courses are being planned online with synchronous learning.

Note: these courses are for students entering the 7th grade ONLY. <u>Returning</u> <u>students</u> or those looking to reinforce skills in math or English are encouraged to consider a credit course.

Course	Description	Schedule	Fee
MATH	In this course, students review and practice essential math skills with a prep teacher.	June 1 – 4 (Mon-Thur)	\$100
READING & GRAMMAR	This is a reading, writing, and grammar course; students will read and discuss a short novel, as well as write their own narrative, descriptive, and analytical composition.	June 8 – 11 (Mon-Thur)	\$100
LATIN	This course offers an experience of the spoken Latin language for beginners and enthusiasts. No prerequisites are required—be prepared for a lively and interactive experience!	June 15 – 18 (Mon-Thur)	\$100
ACADEMY CULTURE	This course is designed for middle school students new to NPX, in order to familiarize them with the schools culture and Socratic practices. It is a good opportunity to practice and form classroom habits and note-taking skills through short lessons, readings and exercises.	June 22 – 25 (Mon-Thur)	\$75
ALL FOUR COURSES	Participate in the full program, all four courses at a reduced rate	June 1 – 26 (Mon-Thur)	\$300

Summer Academy Policies and Procedures

Homework: Homework may be assigned to strengthen student understanding from each class meeting. In order to cover the essential concepts of a semester-long course, instructors will clearly communicate student expectations in this area.

Dress Code: Students must wear their school uniforms to summer school, including testing sessions for Independent Study students. All other policies regarding personal appearance are governed by the North Phoenix Preparatory Academy Family Handbook. NO UNIFORMS WILL BE REQUIRED FOR ONLINE CLASSES

Behavior: Students are expected to behave in a manner consistent with the behavioral expectations of North Phoenix Prep as outlined in the NPX Family Handbook.
