## **OFF BUDGET...**

"Off budget"...these are things happening here at Christ Lutheran that Pastor Groeling and I used to smile, and be filled with joy seeing God doing within our family of faith... and now Pastor Eric and I are seeing the same abundance! It is truly amazing to see God at work.

This really hit me as I prepared for our annual congregation meeting, and then, even more during the meeting. Before the meeting, as I was preparing the celebrations of what God was doing in our Church and School. I realized that the majority of them were "off budget". You can see these celebrations on page 9 of this newsletter – they are truly amazing.

Then I realized it even more during our Congregation Meeting when we were discussing our mission offerings to the Matzke's that we had put on budget during the pandemic that we were now moving back "off budget".

We were doing so because our Sunday School and Sunday Bible Class offerings have gone to the Matzke's for a really long time and have always been not part of the budget. When in the pandemic, and we worshiped online, without Sunday Bible Classes, we put a place for the Matzke's into the budget so we could continue to give. Now we are able to give at the same levels but we are back to giving "off budget" as our Bible and Sunday School Classes are back going in full swing.

This is evident throughout our Church and School. One of the most evident places is with our Board of Human Care. We budget our Stephen Ministry within it, but otherwise our Human Care budget is \$250 a year...\$250 and they don't spend it.

Yet, "off budget" our Board of Human Care is responsible for collecting thousands of dollars worth of items given out at Thanksgiving, Christmas, and throughout the year. You name it, turkeys to socks and underwear, all given to people in need "off budget."

Our quilters quilt "off budget." Our food pantry is supported "off budget". God Cares About You receives all kinds of support "off budget". Our Fellowship Meals almost every week collect for different services, and needs, "off budget." The list goes on and on.

Even though we have an annual budget of about 1.5 million dollars, so much more is given "off budget." The reality though "off budget" is really "in addition to budget".

## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Those of you who know me, know of my beloved Chihuahua, Skippy Jon Jones. He is not long for this world. Skippy Jon is 15+ years. He has diabetes, is going blind, and struggles to move around from place to place. In March, he happened to be sliding down the dog ramp from my bed, to the floor, when suddenly he started screaming. Yes, it was dog screaming. I jumped up and ran around to the bottom of the bed and tried to pick him up. Turns out, his foot had slid off the ramp, and got stuck between the bed and the ramp as his full body weight drove him deep into the crevice. I was yelling as he was screaming as I scooped him up and tried to rescue him. He was terrified, and he turned and bit my wrist. And let me say, it was like something on TV. He bit down 4-5 times in succession between screams. When I realized that I couldn't pick him up without moving the ramp, I set him back down, and moved the ramp. As I set him down, he got another breath, and turned to bite me several times again. After moving the ramp and trying not to drop him, I got a hold of him, and he turned and bit several times for the third time. After holding him close to me for a moment, the cavalry rushed into the bedroom (Marty and Noah), to see him whimpering in my arms as they bled.

Three hours at the ER gave me much time to think. I wasn't the slightest bit mad or upset with Skippy. I could clearly see that he was terrified, and didn't know what he was doing. Even though he hurt me, my love for him never wavered. And somehow, I can see how that's just like God and us. In a sense, we get scared and lash out and "bite" Him, and still His love for us never wavers. What a comforting thought.

My prayer for you this month is that you can trust in the Lord, bite him less, and rejoice in the knowledge that He loves you no matter what!

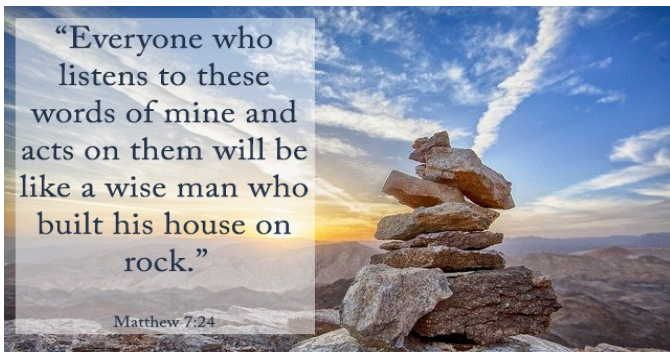

## RAISE RIGHT

(Formerly known as Shop with SCRIP)

Our Fundraising for the month of June.....we sold \$22,283.33 worth of gift cards

We earned \$897.67 dollars of Fundraising money that went to these Distribution groups.

There was \$425.14 that went to the Church and School Technology Fund.

- Deficit Reduction Fund received \$61.17 with 8 families participating
- School Scholarship Fund received \$27.14 with 7 families participating
- School Tuition we distributed \$229.79 with 14 families participating
- School Playground Fund received \$28.20 with 4 families participating
- Church and School Roof Loan received \$10.27 with 3 families participating
- Youth Accounts received \$33.72 with 3 families participating
- God Cares About You Mission received \$11.37 with 4 families participating
- Technology we distributed \$425.14 with 47 families participating, some families put all their distribution towards Technology.

Some numbers to think about ~~~ Let's round the rebates to \$800 per month and the participants to 50, if we had 100 participating we would make roughly \$1,600 a month!! IN REBATES!! Just think if we doubled that to 200 (we have 160 in school and 250 in church) we would make \$3,200 in one month!! IN REBATES!! That would be \$38,400 in one year!!!! IN REBATES!!!! FREE MONEY ~ for the church and school!

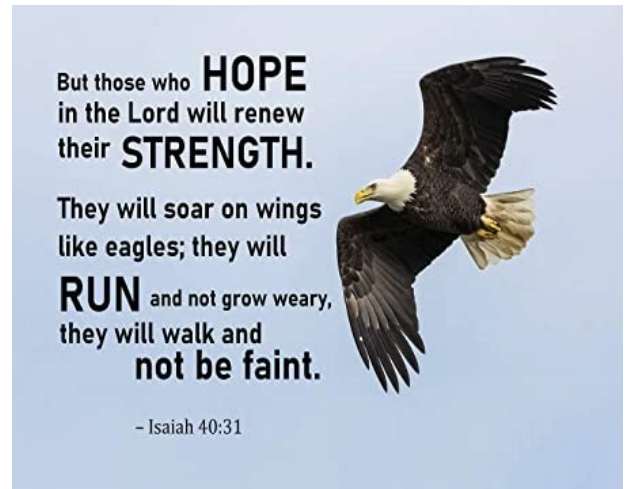
## NOTES FROM THE MUSIC DIRECTOR

## **CELEBRATING 2021-2022 MISSION & MINISTRY**

### **CHRIST LUTHERAN CHURCH & SCHOOL**

As we went into our M&M 22 in August last year, we went into a time of uncertainty. Our Pastor Neal Groeling was retiring to take care of some health concerns. We were going into a time of vacancy. We were slowly coming out of a pandemic. It was a time for concern and prayer.

...and now it is a time to celebrate, still in prayer, for all the good that God has done with our ministry in the last year, and the opportunities and challenges that are before us.

### **SOME HIGHLIGHTS**

- We celebrated Pastor Neal Groeling & family in August
- We stayed together during our 7 month vacancy
- We welcomed Pastor Eric Robinson & family in February
- Our school experienced record K-8 enrollment reaching as many as 171 students
- Through July our general offerings matched last year (up \$123)
- Our School Income (K-8) was up \$85,497
- Our Pre-School Income was up \$81,590
- Hosted LWML District Convention
- GCAY received a \$98,000 Grant from LWML to hire executive director, and another grant this year to hire summer interns next year
- German Montiel called as executive director of GCAY
- \$7,000 was donated to children's ministry at GCAY by Corley Cup
- We received over \$230,000 in grants to support pre-school, improve playgrounds, build security wall, update school website and support our teachers
- Kim Rasmussen awarded Administrator of the Year for the Rocky Mountain District
- Electronic sign was purchased and installed
- A shade structure was put on playground and new wood chips brought in
- A new playground for pre-school has been ordered and funded with grants
- Our capital campaign has raised approximately \$185,000 of \$200,000 goal for new roofs and strengthening our endowments
- New security gates and privacy wall on north campus were installed
- Parish Hall exterior painted by Pro-Pipe Crew
- Received \$150,000 from Yvonne Damerow estate and approximately \$70,000 from Rood Estate for endowments, Mission & Ministry, GCAY, and memorial accounts
- We held a successful VBS with help of many volunteers and leadership of church secretary Janine Morford
- In the process of installing 4 new air conditioning units for pre-school
- Anne McBrayer became our new bookkeeper and Jessica Nixon as Treasurer
- Rev. David Clark commissioned as a Stephen Leader
- Celebrated multiple baptisms in church and school
- Waylon, Gerson, and Regan were confirmed
- Stephen Ministry active, inside and outside our church community
- Bell Choir, Choir, and Joyful Noise enhancing our worship
- Three Adult Bible Studies, Sunday School, and Youth Sunday Bible studies
