Dear Friends in Christ,

Reaching non-Christians was the highest priority for the early church. Indeed the very 'call to arms' of Christ for His Church was to reach out and make disciples."

One of our most important outreach and discipleship tools is our school. Every year Christ Lutheran School touches the lives of hundreds of individuals - some churched and others unchurched; some believers and others non-believers. Our school touches the lives of children, parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins and friends with the love of Jesus Christ. This is evidenced in the numbers of baptisms, conversations, those in worship in our church and others, and in the passion so many evidence for our school.

Our Christ-centered education not only challenges students academically, but shapes their character and presents a biblical based world view in order to equip them to impact our culture and community in Christ-centered ways for years to come. It is challenging, in a culture becoming increasingly hostile to Christianity, to keep the doors of a Christian school open and to attract new families and students. We work hard to face and meet those challenges every year, and sometimes everyday.

I am thankful for our school. I am often stopped by parents and students who want to share stories of how the school has impacted their lives. These stories are heartwarming, and reinforce the importance of our school ministry. As Thanksgiving approaches, I am mindful that the school is such a visible ministry in our midst, that we often take it for granted and forget to be deliberate in our support of what God is doing.

It is easy to take our school, staff, students, and families for granted. As our school continues to grow and be a vital component of mission and outreach, I am asking, and even challenging, all of our members to commit to the following actions in continued support of our school:

1. Pray for Christ Lutheran School daily. Pray for the spiritual health and lives of our staff, our students, and their families. Pray for the Lord to guide new students and families to our school, and pray for our school to be a powerful influence in the lives of others and in the life of our community.

2. Promote our school with neighbors, friends, families and others. Promote it with them even if they themselves do not have children! I'm sure they know others who have children. Speak to them about our passion for sharing Jesus, and for shaping lives to engage the world with Him, serving Him in whatever vocation to which they are ultimately called. Our school is a "hidden gem" in the Northeast Heights. Let's help it to visibly shine so others see its beauty and value.

3. Praise and Thank the Lord for our school! I could have placed this under praying for our school, but I wanted to call attention to it separately. Praise and Thank the Lord for our excellent staff! Praise and Thank the Lord for the mission opportunities by and to our school. Praise and Thank the Lord for the multitude of ways that lives are being changed for eternity!

4. Partner with our school! Volunteer to help read to a child, to serve as a coach, to mentor a student, to share your faith (life) story. In short, engage with our school and with it's mission. You can help with an hour here or there, or with several hours at a time.

These are just four simple things – Pray, Promote, Praise, and Partner. Let's continue the work of building our school, remembering the God-given power it has by the Word of God to change lives in service to the world and to Him!

They are doing wonderful work with these African families, sharing the love of Jesus and His truth in the Swahili language. Our God has supplied a need of this ministry in Josias and Chantal, and to our God and Father we give all glory for this great blessing and for supplying our every need.



Weekly Scripture Readings & Sermon Summaries November 2019

November 3, 2019 – Twenty-first Sunday after Pentecost *All Saints’ Day Observed. Psalm 149; Revelation 7:2-17; 1 John 3:1-3, “God’s Israel” - Sermon Text: Revelation 7:9-10 - Rev. Shayne Jonker. “They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.” Only the blood of Jesus will do. Your blood cannot cleanse sin. Nor can the sweat of your labors or the tears of your contrition. There is no such thing as sinless saints, only forgiven ones. If you say you have no sin, you’re fooling yourself. Temptations abound, and sin comes all too naturally to the natural born sinner. But the blood of Jesus Christ, God’s Son, cleanses us from all sin.

November 10, 2019 – Twenty-second Sunday after Pentecost

Psalm 148; 2 Thessalonians 2:1-8,13-17; Luke 20:27-40, “God Chose You” - Sermon Text: 2 Thessalonians 2:13 - Rev. Paul Shoemaker. To comfort the Thessalonians, the Apostle Paul reminds them, “God chose you to be saved.” God comforts us with those same words. “God chose you.” So that you may have peace, we are reminded He chose you to be with Him forever.

November 17, 2019 – Twenty-third Sunday after Pentecost

Psalm 98; 2 Thessalonians 3:1-13; Luke 21:5-28, “Don’t Get Tired!” - Sermon Text: 2 Thessalonians 3:1-13 - Rev. Bill Mueller. With all of the pressures that Christians face today, it is easy to understand why many of us are so tired! However, God, through the words of the Apostle Paul, encourages us not to get tired! Why? Because the Lord is faithful!

November 24, 2019 – Last Sunday of the Church Year

Psalm 46; Colossians 1:13-20; Luke 23:39-43, “What’s Your Epitaph?” - Sermon Text: Colossians 1:18 - Rev. Dr. Thomas Ahlersmeyer. An “epitaph” is a pithy statement that sums up a life, something you might see inscribed on a gravestone. What is the measure of *your* life? What’s your epitaph?



You're wondering, is this right for me? Consider this:

A Stephen Minister is a person who shows compassion, gives encouragement, and intercedes for those he or she care for. Many Stephen Ministers say that they receive much more from the caring relationship with their care receiver than they give. A Stephen Minister devotes time and energy, a Stephen Minister has the chance to participate in meaningful ministry, make a major difference in another person's life, and grow as a joyous child of God.

A Stephen Minister completes 50 hours of training before ever meeting with a care receiver. He or she learns about listening, assertiveness, confidentiality, and many other aspects of caregiving. After the initial training, he or she engages in continuing education. Stephen Ministers find that their relationships become richer and deeper at home, church, and work and with friends.

A Stephen Minister is open to adjusting and adapting his or her caregiving to fit the needs of the care receiver. He or she learns more about caregiving at each meeting with a care receiver and at each supervision session. Stephen Ministry is an experience of continuous learning, growth, and joy.


