FROM PASTOR ERIC

I've now been here long enough to write two newsletters! And while I am finally able to locate where most things are on campus, there is still so much to learn about the Christ Lutheran community. One of my favorite refrains that I have said so far has been, "We do that? Great!" It's very exciting to be part of a community that takes service to others so seriously. Being in a community that is filled with so many leaders who are happy to work quietly on the things God has put in front of them makes a huge difference to people that really need the help. If I am being honest, this is the kind of thing that would make plenty of my colleagues a little jealous.

Now that we are out of Lent and past Easter, it is a great time to remind ourselves that everything we do is because God raised Jesus from the dead. Serving the vulnerable and those in need is a great thing in and of itself, of course, but we don't do these things simply because they are the right things to do. Instead, we serve others because our service is part of a much larger story of God renewing all things in the wake of Resurrection Life breaking into our world.



In 1 Corinthians 15, Paul gives one of the most important summaries of why the resurrection of Jesus is so vital to us as followers of Jesus. He talks about how if God hadn't raised Jesus, nothing we do would matter and that we would still be dead in our sins. He also gives us the promise that what God did for Jesus, he will do for us as well. Finally, at the conclusion of this chapter (one of the most important in all the scriptures), he also says this (vs 58): *Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain.*

In other words, the work we do for the sake of the Gospel has meaning. It carries over and won't just disappear. It *matters*. And one day, when all is said and done and Resurrection Life is all over creation, we will be able to look back and get to see that while God did everything, we got to play a small part in it.

He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

As I mentioned last month, we are in desperate need for volunteers to support our VBS this year. Janine, our Administrative Assistant, has volunteered to serve as the Chairperson this year, but cannot do the job without leadership help and volunteers. This is a one-week commitment and a HUGE outreach opportunity.

Many neighborhood and school children attend our VBS. This is a way for us to share the Gospel. In the past it has led children and families to involvement in both our school and church. This is true kingdom work.

Also if you are looking for ways of serving through your financial gifts, we are in great need going into the summer, which is our most challenging time of the year financially. Our Mission and Ministry is a twelve-month ministry. God has gifted us with many mission opportunities through our school, God Cares About You, the Matzke's, and Benjamin Helge.

We also have large expenses in upkeep of our campus, utilities, church and school staff, worship and more. This results in a very large budget, well over 1.2 million dollars, with the majority supported by our gifts and school tuitions.

This year with the lingering pandemic, and our six-month Pastoral vacancy, (historically giving falls off during vacancy) we have fallen behind on our projections for financial giving.

FROM STEWARDSHIP

2020-2022 CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

I realize it's only May and football season is months away for us diehard fans – so pardon the analogy.

The Capital Campaign is in the fourth quarter and we're at the 10-yard line pushing for victory. After 18 months of this 2-year effort, we've collected a little over \$180,000 towards our goal of \$200,000. The needs were critical – replace the church and school roofs, repair numerous issues at the Parish Hall, and infuse capital into our depleted endowment fund.

With six months remaining, we're asking those with outstanding pledges to continue their commitment to this fund drive – about \$12,000 is the amount of pledged donations outstanding. And for everyone, whether you pledged or not, we prayerfully request any support to the "roof fund" over this final stretch to bring us over the goal line - \$200,000.






