Dear Friends in Christ,

The greatest danger to Christianity and the church today is not from a direct attack by Satan, but from the subtle shifts our culture is causing in the way people think. Our culture is teaching us that it is acceptable to make moral and ethical decisions based upon one's own self-interests and desires, rather than seeking that which is pleasing to God. It is now becoming acceptable to PUBLICLY adjust one's moral and ethical standards on a situational or cultural basis without being viewed as hypocritical. For example, the corporate executive is allowed to make business decisions that may be ethically questionable, as long as he is a faithful husband, and a good father. The factory worker who faithfully goes to church every Sunday can pilfer tools and other miscellaneous items from his employer, as long as he puts in a hard day at work. The focus on self, rather than on God, allows sinful human beings to determine what they feel is best for themselves rather than trusting God to know what is best for them.

While situational and cultural morality have been practiced for thousands of years, Christians have always understood them to be wrong, and has spoken out against them. However, this no longer seems to be the case. Even those who identify themselves as Christian often accept, or even participate in, these types of behavior. It is okay to lead an immoral life during the week as long as you worship God on the weekend. I wonder if one could imagine St. Paul, or St. Peter, living private lives directly opposed to God's Word during the week while publicly teaching the value of God's Word for one's life on the weekend. This type of behavior would certainly not be pleasing to God. And yet, we in today's culture are ready and even willing to excuse it, dismiss it, or find it acceptable.

The Church in particular, and Christians in general, have failed to speak out about the moral and ethical issues affecting our society in a clear and effective manner. Our culture has grown more and more self-centered and self-serving than ever before. This is evidenced by the simple question: "Who are our heroes?" They are no longer those who give of themselves to contribute to our society in a way that changes people's lives, rather they are the YouTube stars, the musicians, the athletes, or others who, for the most part, serve only themselves. Success is no longer measured by how you serve others, but rather by the fame and money you earn for yourself.

As long as our culture remains self-focused, and if the Church continues to remain silent, then Satan will continue to win the battle. Christianity is, at its very core, a teaching that stands in direct opposition to situational and cultural morality and the self-centeredness that are upheld in our culture today. Being a Christian is not about serving one's own self interests, it is about serving our risen Lord! Christianity is not about "what's in it for me?" it is about what God does for me and with me for His sake. Christianity is not about living by the Word on Sunday and living by the world on Monday. Christianity is not just a part of one's life, but the whole of who one is in Christ Jesus.

Life is not about being true to ourselves, it is about being true to Jesus Christ who gave His life for our sake. Do not fall into the trap laid by Satan! Do not believe the lies he tells. Get yourself back into the Word of God, and listen to the clear voice of Jesus tell you about what it means to live a life committed to Him. Listen to the voice of Jesus tell you how much He loves you and cares for you. Listen to Him tell you how important you are to Him and His kingdom. Listen as he calls you to set aside the world for His Word, and your selfishness for His selflessness.

Remember the words of the second chapter of Philippians: " <sup>1</sup> If you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if

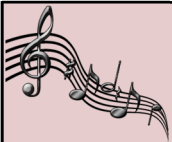

any fellowship with the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion,<sup>2</sup> then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose.<sup>3</sup> Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves.<sup>4</sup> Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others.<sup>5</sup> Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus:<sup>6</sup> Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped,<sup>7</sup> but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.<sup>8</sup> And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death—even death on a cross!"

It is time for Christians to be bold in faith, bold in proclamation, and bold in practice. It is time to live no longer for ourselves, but for Jesus Christ who dies for us!

ex-wife, but could not get through. We believe Jesus brought him to God Cares About You Mission to plant a seed of faith and change in his heart. We know the mighty Word of God will not return void, regarding this young man, and all who hear God's Word of hope at the Mission.

This is one of the many stories of why we do what we do here at the mission. You would be surprised to hear how long it has been for some people to eat BBQ hamburgers and hotdogs. We complain about not having enough money, about bills, what to wear, and these people are happy with just a simple hamburger. ### October 6, 2019 – Seventeenth Sunday after Pentecost

Psalms 62; 2 Timothy 1:1-14; Luke 17:1-10, “Spirit of Power” - Sermon Text: 2 Timothy 1:1-14 - Rev. Bill Mueller. God always gives what God’s people always need at the time it is always most effective. The Apostle Paul reminds us that God has not given us a spirit of timidity but the Spirit of Power. What does this mean? While it doesn’t mean we can leap tall buildings, it does mean God does not desert us in the midst of extreme challenges. In fact, He is with us to grow us in faith in Jesus.

### October 13, 2019 – Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost

Psalms 111; 2 Timothy 2:1-10; Luke 17:11-19, “I’m Grateful” - Sermon Text: Luke 17:11-19 - Rev. Dr. Thomas Ahlersmeyer, “I’m Grateful” not only is the appropriate response all the blessings of body and soul given to us by our great God, but it also has the power to change the lives of those around us and even shape the world in which we live. An attitude of “I’m Grateful” is a gift from God in response to the gifts of God, especially the “inexpressible Gift” of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

### October 20, 2019 – Nineteenth Sunday after Pentecost

Psalms 121; 2 Timothy 3:14-17; Luke 18:1-8, “Total Protection” - Sermon Text: Psalm 121 - Rev. Dr. Walter Maier III. We live in a dangerous world. But Psalm 121 assures us that we have total protection from God. The good news is that God guards us in all aspects of our life.

### October 27, 2019 – Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost

#### \*Reformation Observed

Psalms 46; Romans 3:19-28; John 8:31-36, “Trust in Jesus” - Sermon Text: John 8:31 - Rev. Dr. Lawrence Rast, Jr. The Reformation was a miracle done purely by God’s grace, which returned the church’s focus to faith in Jesus Christ. Today the church is struggling in the United States with continuing decline. But that is nothing new, as John 8:31-26 shows us. The basic message has been the same yesterday, today, and into the future: Trust in Jesus.

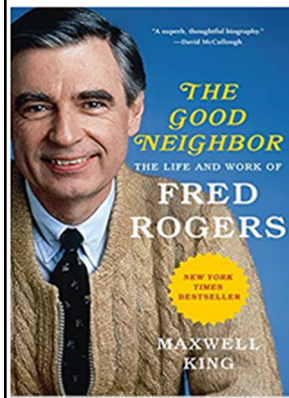
