FROM THE DIRECTOR OF YOUTH, FAMILY LIFE, & SCHOOL MINISTRIES

If you attended school chapel services in February, you may recognize this story! It was too much fun talking with the kids about it not to share here as well.


When we see an animal in the wild, whether it's a lion, a bear, or a snake (or the scariest wild animal ever – a hippo), we can experience an inherent sense of unease. At least I do! These creatures, that are untamed and unpredictable, remind us of the raw power and danger that exist in the world. The wild can be mysterious and often frightening – especially if you are unprepared for a fight.

When we see the same animals in a zoo, our feelings change. Instead of being paralyzed by fear, we can be curious. We can look at the animals up close. A barrier, whether a fence or glass, keeps us separated. The zoo provides a controlled environment, where the same dangerous animals no longer have the power to harm us. We can identify their strength without experiencing the same panic that would grip us in the wild.

In many ways, this zoo experience can help us understand the nature of evil and the protective power of Jesus. Just as the zoo's barriers protect us from powerful and unpredictable animals, Jesus stands as a barrier between us and the dangers of evil. Evil, like the wild, can be terrifying and overwhelming. It can take many forms—fear, temptation, sin, suffering—but through Christ, we are shielded from its ultimate harm. He is the one who keeps us safe and helps us face life's challenges.

In 1 John 4:4, it says, "The one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world." This verse reminds us that, while evil is real and frightening, Jesus is greater. Just like the zoo's barrier protects us from dangerous animals, Jesus protects us from the ultimate harm that evil can bring. He makes what could be terrifying no longer scary.



NOTES FROM THE MUSIC DIRECTOR

"This is My Son, My Chosen One; listen to Him!" Luke 9:35

March 2 is Transfiguration Sunday. We hear the words of the Father echoing the blessing He spoke at Jesus' baptism. The glory of God lights up the world and shows us our destiny as adopted children and coheirs with the King of His glory in heaven. Moses and Elijah, who appeared with Him, speak with Him of His departure and what He must accomplish in Jerusalem. We are one with Him as we walk with Him on the path that leads to His death and then His victorious resurrection! The choir anthem is "This Is My Beloved Son." The 11 a.m. service will be led by our Kindergarten-3rd grade presenting "Donkey Tales."

The season of Lent begins on March 5, Ash Wednesday. The choir anthem is "Touch Me with Ashes." During church services, we receive a cross of ashes on our forehead reminding us of our human mortality and as a sign of our repentance, sorrow, and need for grace. In Baptism we were made His children, and the Holy Spirit continues to work in us through Word and Sacrament until that day when we experience the fullness of God's grace at the throne of the Lamb.

As we endeavor to meet the challenges set forth in the past year and work to implement the goals from our Vision Task Force, we will continue our annual pledge process with "Commitment 2025" on Commitment Sunday, March 30th. Pastor Robinson will communicate special emphasis this year on the weeks prior to pledging by recognizing the many missions supported by Christ Lutheran, and the concurrent need for time and effort from congregation members to sustain these programs.

We're now more than halfway through the fiscal year of 2025. Thus far this year's budget goals are being met. Our successful scholarship fund drive, the Gala, and your

consistent offerings were necessary to help us transition to a sustainable financial framework for the future of Christ Lutheran Church and School. Offerings are up over 8% from last year. The scholarship fund has received over \$70,000. Combined with the February Gala, these inputs are essential to meet this year's budget goal.

A FEW THOUGHTS ABOUT A "CRYING CHURCH" AND OUR VISION

A few months ago, I saw an article entitled "We Need a Crying Church". The author was lamenting how quiet our churches have become because there are no babies crying or restless toddlers. Congregations have gown old and quiet. We are losing the next generation.

The last Sunday in January at the late service the children from our school sang. Young families filled the church. The church was noisy before, during and after the service. Quite a contrast to our normal Sundays.

In early January the Vision Task Force and the Council presented a Vision to the congregation seeking to answer the questions: Where is God leading? How are we going to get there? Allow me to update you on our progress.

We seek to grow God's Kingdom as we renew the congregation and provide a sustainable financial future for our school; our primary mission field. These are actions that have been completed or are on-going.

- More youth involved in the worship service. (Ongoing)
- Seek more volunteers. (Volunteer focus will be part of our March Commitment process.)
- Host classes for members, school parents & others. (Gift Planning Workshop completed.)
- Provide School Newsletter to congregation members. (Done)
- Lay Ministers are contacting 50% of members by Easter & 100% by Memorial Day.
- Strengthen relationships with school families. (Ongoing)
- Renew youth program. (Ongoing)
- Complete Capital Campaign for Scholarship Fund. (Exceeding our \$110,000 Goal.)
- Establish Sustainable School Funding Model (Ongoing)
- Host School Fund Raising Gala (Done)
- Reduce Expenses (Ongoing with current budget process.)

Your suggestions and involvement are needed. Our vision is a work in progress. YOUR PRAYERS ARE NEEDED as God works His will in our congregation. We have not yet developed a nice short Vision Statement. But on the Sunday the children sang God gave us a video: A Noise Filled Church.
