

### FROM PASTOR ERIC

When I was in my late 20s I served on the board of a local organization that would often start meetings with the question, "What's keeping you from being present here and now in this meeting?" I always thought the question was a little too touchy-feely and personal, but I could usually come up with something along the lines of the pile of things I have to accomplish. Now that I've grown a bit, I think I didn't like that question for two reasons. First, it was a veiled invitation to be vulnerable, which was scary. And second, it forced me to admit to myself, even for a moment, that maybe I'm not superman and there's no way I could keep up with all the things I have piled on for myself. Regardless of how I answered in that particular setting, the truth was usually that entirely too much kept me from being present most of the time.

The genius of that question, assuming we could get out of our heads, is that everyone had at least something, and most of us had many things, that continued to demand our attention long after or long before we took care of it. Part of it was the nature of where I lived at the time, as Silicon Valley type people tend to have too many irons in the fire. But we all know that this is more of a "people" issue.

As I am writing this, Advent is just around the corner. Advent is the time of year we look ahead to the coming of the King and celebrate his birth. It's a time of preparation and anticipation, and it's also a time when we take on so many other things in preparation for the holidays. And it's difficult to be present for the birth of Jesus when our minds are a million miles away with plans, frustrations, worries, and long lists of things to do. Not that all of these are bad, of course. But how can we be present for the important things if we aren't first aware that we aren't present? So, I ask you – What is keeping you from being present and in the moment as we look ahead to the birth of Jesus? What keeps pulling you away? Sometimes, answers to those questions reveal what is stealing our joy. My hope and prayer for all of us this time of year is that when we sing "Joy to the World," we mean it.

### **Financial Summary**

Actual Income \$500,396 Actual Expense \$549,307 -\$48,911

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

One quarter of the fiscal year has passed. We are operating in a budget deficit. We have a net cash flow of -\$48,911 versus -\$42,114 reported last month. Our expenditures exceed our income. This is the total money expended from our bank and savings accounts, not a performance to budget metric.

In terms of our budget, last month we had a -\$45,727 budget to actual income deficit. This month we have a -\$54,861 budget to actual income deficit.

Offering is -\$4,489 less than budget compared to -\$2,984 in my previous report. School income is -\$36,039 than budget versus -\$28,984 in my last report. A possible increase in preschool enrollment may help reduce the school income deficit.

For clarification, fundraising and scholarships are not included in the school income number. Since school fundraising is an independent line in the budget, school fundraising does not offset a school income deficit. Both school income and school fundraising are necessary to meet budget. School fundraising is sporadic and difficult to model, so this month I did not increase the budgeted number for school fundraising.

We need a money surplus going into the summer to pay staff salaries when there is no traditional school income and church offerings decrease. Again, I recommend we address the current deficit immediately.

Thank you to the boards for staying below budget with their expenses.
