Dear Friends,

At times in our lives we find ourselves in the middle of events that seem to be out of control or in situations that seem to have no way out. Our nation's recent election for president illustrates this to some extent, as does the current pandemic. Other examples come from every day life --- a car accident, a diagnosis of cancer, a death of someone close, a fight with a family member, a hurtful conversation with someone, loss of job, etc. In the midst of these and other life-changing situations, feelings of being powerless, isolated, all alone, can often sweep over us and begin to control our actions and emotions, leaving us frightened and paralyzed with no hope. They can even erode our faith if we take our eyes off of Jesus. The storms of this world send insurmountable waves our direction, and we falter – unless we pause, take a deep breath, and once again focus on the cross of Jesus.

The author of the Letter to the Hebrews writes: [“]² Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. ³ Consider him who endured such opposition from sinful men, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.” (*Hebrews 12:2-3*)

Focusing our eyes on the cross of Jesus brings a restored or even new perspective to all of our life situations. We realize that no matter what happens in this world – we are never all alone! Jesus suffered all on the cross for our sake that we might belong to Him! And because we belong to Him, He never leaves us nor forsakes us, but strengthens us through His Word, through prayer, and through the gift of His Body and Blood in Holy Communion, drawing us closer to Himself everyday.

Where is your focus in life? Is it worldly centered or Kingdom centered? Is it self-centered or Christ centered? We never know what turns the path of our life is going to take. We do not know from one day to the next which event is going to tragically touch our hearts, which situation is going to throw us into despair, or what circumstance will alter our best laid plans. We do not know the celebrations and the joys that may come our way. We do not know what tomorrow may hold. We only know the promises of Jesus Christ and Him crucified—we only know His Love, His Grace, His Mercy and His Hope.

As we journey through the season of Advent to Bethlehem, to a stable and a manger, our focus is on the birth of the Christ child. A birth we celebrate because He brings Hope to a fallen and sinful world. We celebrate knowing this is the same Jesus who years later gives His life on a cross for the salvation of the whole world. He reminds us in the midst of what will certainly be a “different” Christmas this year, that even still “Our hope is built on nothing less than Jesus’ blood and righteousness!” We celebrate no one else, we hope in no one else, and we depend on no one else but Him and Him Alone! We remember the words of the angel: “Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.” Fix your eyes on Jesus!

Thank You!!

First and foremost, thank you to all who participated in our pledge drive for the school and church roofs and our rainy day fund in October and early November. Although the total amount pledged fell a bit short of our \$200,000 goal, we're optimistic about our ability to meet our needs over the next two years.

The amount donated already is encouraging as we try to retire the \$150,000 loan from Lutheran Church Extension Fund as soon as possible. Interest on this loan begins to accrue in April 2021, so any early donation toward your pledge would greatly benefit our chances of minimizing any interest charges. Throughout the next two years, whether you pledged or not, please consider doing what you can to assist us in this endeavor.

Additionally, the results are in for our first quarter offerings. Historically, the August to October quarter is lower than others and this FY2021 first quarter followed that trend. We averaged \$9384 per week, about \$500 per week lower than the first quarter of FY2020 and \$330/week below budget for this fiscal year. Traditionally we have made up the budget shortfall with Christmas and year end giving. Please consider a special offering again this year.

As Pastor has indicated on numerous occasions, the budget estimate for this year is truly guesswork. But thus far, we're doing pretty well in meeting the challenge. Understanding the months ahead will be unpredictable, we pray that 2021 will provide a brighter future for all, that the missions of Christ Lutheran will continue to flourish and that although challenging, our financial situation will continue to be somewhat stable and manageable.

Again, thank you to all for your on-going generous support – financially and prayerfully.



We are continuing to collect mites on the second Sunday, if that doesn't work you can drop them off at church anytime.

Grant #6 Mobile Medical Mercy Mission Bus for Guatemala — Lutheran Church of Guatemala and Child Beyond International ~ Once the funds are received, a bus named the “4M Bus” will be purchased, retrofitted, and stocked with medical and Bible school equipment. This will enable the teams to bring healing, both physically and spiritually, to Guatemalan children and adults in isolated and remote villages. Your mites matter.

Grant #7 “Restoring Hope for Detroit Children and Families — Detroit has experienced economic disaster, with nearly 60 percent of its children living in poverty, the highest rate in the country. Camp Restore Detroit provides a place for children and adults of the city’s devastated Ninth Precinct to learn about God’s love as they participate in art, theatre, music classes, and receive homework help. Adults are offered parenting, finance, and resumé-building classes. Remember Detroit by remembering your mites for this LWML grant!

Grant #8 Lights for Christ scholarships in Guatemala. Lights for Christ Program in Zacapa, Guatemala, provides spiritual, physical, and educational support for children and their families who are economically dependent on the municipal landfill. With your mites, this program will continue to expand and share Christ’s blessings.

Grant #9 Wind River Indian Reservation Transportation Fort Washakie, WY The Wind River Lutheran Mission (WRLM) works with the Shoshone and Arapaho tribes in WY and is currently the only existing full-time mission with a resident pastor. A large part of this ministry focuses on outreach to the children of the Wind River Indian Reservation. Very few families have reliable transportation for their children to attend Bible classes in Fort Washakie and Crowheart. In most instances, this is the only opportunity to share the Gospel of Christ with them. A suitable vehicle will be purchased with this grant money, so the children will be able to travel to participate in the Sunday school at Fort Washakie and the “Monday” school at Crowheart.

Grant #10 Ministry in Motion Trinity Lutheran Church, Mobile, Alabama. This grant will provide transportation to and from church in a bus that provides easier and safer access for all ages with lower steps and handrails, a wider door, and wider rows and aisles.

- * All District Conventions may be postponed from 2021 to 2022 due to the pandemic.








Flower Chart


