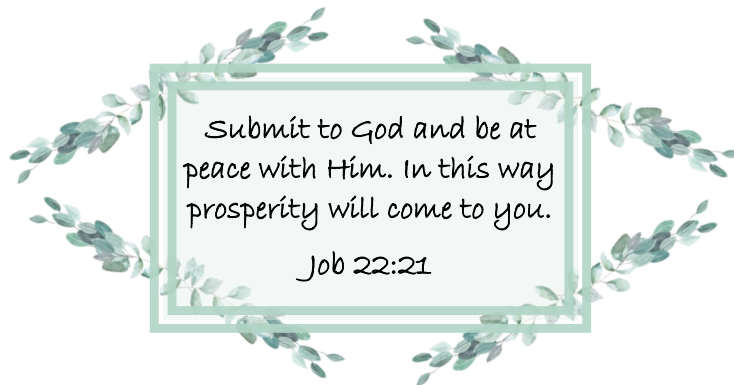

NEW YEAR—NEW CHALLENGES

Three years ago, we faced an enormous challenge – roof leaks requiring immediate, major repairs. Over the next few months, we contracted for the work, obtained a loan from the Lutheran Church Extension Fund, and began planning a fund raiser in the face of an expanding pandemic.

As always, the congregation met those challenges. Last September we concluded the two-year capital campaign. The past year brought us a new Pastor and our school continued it's fantastic record of providing quality education to our youth. Offerings remained predictable and thanks to generous past members, their estates have made our endowment accounts healthier than they've been in many years.

Now 2023 – a new year with new challenges – some known, others unknown. To meet some of those challenges, historically we've looked at two financial sources to help – endowments and the "Building Fund." For the 2020-2022 Capital Campaign, we "kidnapped" this fund and renamed it the "Roof Fund." Last October, with it's mission completed, the fund has reverted to it's original purpose as the "Building Fund" to meet needs not fully covered by our normal budget process. An example, we need to replace over 20 air conditioning units over the next 8-10 years at a cost of \$8-10,000 per year. Our budget only covers a portion of this need – the Building Fund hopefully can fund the balance. Many of us look for other areas of the Church budget to support above-and-beyond normal giving. Please consider the Building Fund if you're able.

Finally, thanks to the outstanding messaging from Pastor Robinson, the Commitment 2023 program will probably exceed the level of success we saw pre-pandemic. We encourage anyone who has not done so, please submit your 2023 pledge by March 5th.

DON'T GIVE UP ANYTHING FOR LENT—ADD SOMETHING INSTEAD

No, I'm not really telling you to skip giving something up for Lent if you are so inclined. I understand sacrificing something during the Lenten Season is an outward response to Jesus' ultimate sacrifice for us.

I have seen some remarkable things happen to people as they have sacrificed and given up certain indulgences as we walk through the season of Lent in anticipation of Jesus' suffering, death and ultimately His resurrection giving us the promise of eternal life and forgiveness of our sins.

I am merely making the suggestion of adding something in response to His love and sacrifice for each of us. There are so many ways we can respond in a contemplative, and deliberate way to the love Jesus has shown for us. What better time to do it than during Lent.

We can by deliberately setting time each day in prayer. Quiet time set aside to just talk to God, listen to God and to open up to His will for us. Be intentional, in the morning, or the evening (or both), to pray on a daily basis.

Another possible add for Lent if you do not do so already, is to perhaps add a daily devotion or meditation. Open your mind and your heart and do so on a daily basis. Perhaps it has been a while since you spent quiet time in the word. I can't think of a better time than now, during Lent to add this to your daily routine.

Maybe this Lenten Season is a time that you can add attending our Wednesday worship if you do not do so already. Use the additional time of worship to honor God in response to His love for us and also to be fed through the worship, word, and teaching that you can receive during these mid-week worship services.

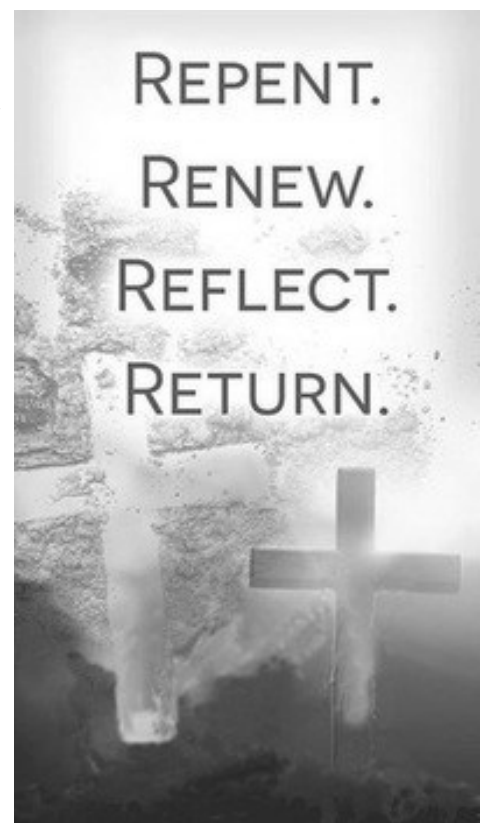
If not attending Sunday Bible classes perhaps add this to your Sunday mornings. I can promise you that you will come away fed and I am not talking about the donuts. Here is a fun idea as something to add during Lent. Invite a friend or neighbor to come to church with you. God may use this response you make to Him to enter into your friend or neighbor's heart. I cannot think of anything more joyous than this.

FROM STEPHEN MINISTRY

People often ask, "What exactly is a Stephen Minister?" One way to put it is that the Stephen Ministers are the *After People*.

Stephen Ministers are there:

- ... *after* the phone call you hoped you'd never get.
- ... *after* the funeral, when everyone has left and the emotions you've held at bay come crashing in on you.
- ... *after* the relationship falls apart and the bottom falls out of your life.
- ... *after* the doctor says, "I'm sorry, but there's nothing more we can do."
- ... *after* the nursing home director shakes your hand and says, "Welcome to your new home."
- ... *after* the last child honks the horn, waves, and drives away—and the house suddenly seems empty.
- ... *after* the gravel comes down, the handcuffs, go on, and your loved one is led away.
- ... *after* the baby arrives, demanding more of you than you ever dreamed possible.
- ... *after* you find a pink slip with your final paycheck.
- ... *after* your family and friends have heard your story one too many times, but you still need to talk it out.

Stephen Ministers are the After People. They are ready to come alongside you—or your friends, neighbors, coworkers, or relatives—and provide comfort and support for as long *after* as needed.

The overpowering smell of moth balls was the first thing I noticed. Then, as I began to look through what was inside, there were some handmade baby clothes, what looked like a baptism gown, and a blanket. Everything inside had been used, and all the cloth items were in disrepair, with aged yellow stains, tears, or holes. And as I moved all of it from the trunk to the trash bag, I couldn't help wondering if there were some Plague, or Typhoid germs stored along with the rest of the items. That's when it hit me. ¹⁹ "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. ²⁰ But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹ For where your treasure is, there your heart will be

also." Matthew 6:19-21. All those precious 'things' we think are so important will fade. Let's keep our hearts in God's Word and store up those heavenly treasures that will never fade!

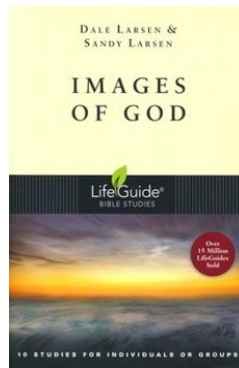

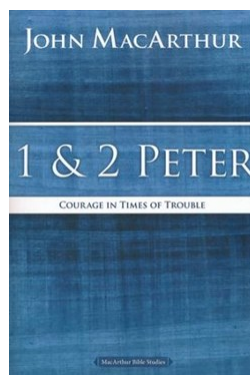
