IT'S MORE THAN ADDITION & SUBTRACTION

Our refugee tutoring program is so much more than teaching addition and subtraction; teaching children to read; helping and assisting these students with their homework and bringing them up to speed in class. It is so much more, because it is truly work, to assist these children and their families to not only grow academically but to grow into the family of Christ.

For those that do not know, we have an African Worship Community that meets at 1pm on Sundays in our church. I have had the opportunity to go to this worship and see the passion for Jesus in the community. I urge you to do also. Some in this community also worship at our traditional services on occasion. A number of them have children in our school. They participate in our fellowship events. They are a part of our church and school family and the family of Jesus.

When we moved the refugee tutoring program up to our church and school at the beginning of the school year we did so for a number of the reasons. One, because most in the program live across the city and no longer in the international district. Another big reason we moved it is because a number of those involved worship at our church and are involved with us in our church family.

By bringing the program to our church and school we are welcoming them into our church family. A number of these children come from families that are not part of the one o'clock Worship community, do not have a relationship with Jesus at all. This program gives the opportunity for them to bridge into that community as well as learn their numbers and ABC's. It is an opportunity for us serve and be ambassadors for Christ.

When I was growing up I went to a neighborhood gym to play basketball. It happened to be a part of a church. People I played basketball with invited me to their youth group.

From there, I joined the choir, started going to Bible studies and worship and soon The Holy Spirit led me into a relationship with Christ. Following me came my sister, brother and parents. All today have either died with the love of Jesus in their hearts or are now active in their faith. This is my story.

It is my Prayer that the same can happen with our tutoring program. That these kids come for help with their math, science, history and reading but are fed not just academically, but with their faith. My prayer is that some then join our worship community, either at 1pm or 11am or 8:15 am. That some of them come to our school.

Our Fundraising for the month of September.....we sold \$25,097.01 worth of gift cards We earned \$1,002 dollars of Fundraising money that went to these Distribution groups. There was \$510.93 that went to the "Church and School Technology Fund".

- Deficit Reduction received \$55.15 with 12 families participating
- School Scholarship Fund received \$28.12 with 8 families participating
- School Tuition we distributed \$263.04 with 19 families participating
- Youth Accounts received \$39.50 with 4 families participating
- God Cares About You Mission received \$2.82 with 2 families participating
- Technology we distributed \$510.93 with 57 families participating, some families put all their distribution towards Technology

A NEW CHALLENGE

On September 30th, we concluded the 2020-2022 Capital Campaign to fund roof replacements, Parish Hall repairs and a depleted church endowment fund. With the successful conclusion of that drive, the "Roof Fund" no longer exists, but reverts to its original status as our "Building Fund."

Which brings us to another appeal – not a formal fund raising campaign, but an informal appeal to generate support for this vital account. The Building Fund exists to provide financial support for off-budget needs as they occur on our campus. In the near future this includes replacement of 17 air conditioning units (about \$8-9,000 each) over the next 8-10 years, resurfacing the parking lot (last done almost 10 years ago) and repairs to the stucco on the exterior of some of our older buildings.

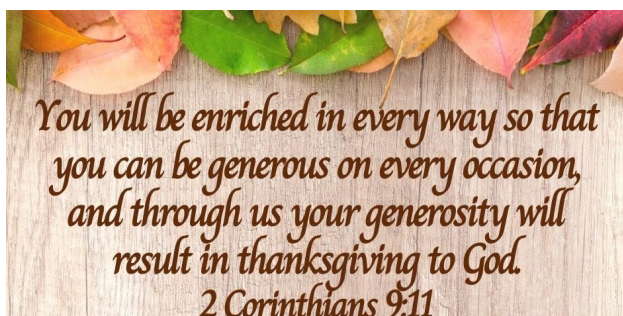
With your ongoing support, these projects can be at least partially funded through donations to the "Building Fund," not at the level of the recent capital campaign, but at some level so that we meet the needs of our aging campus. 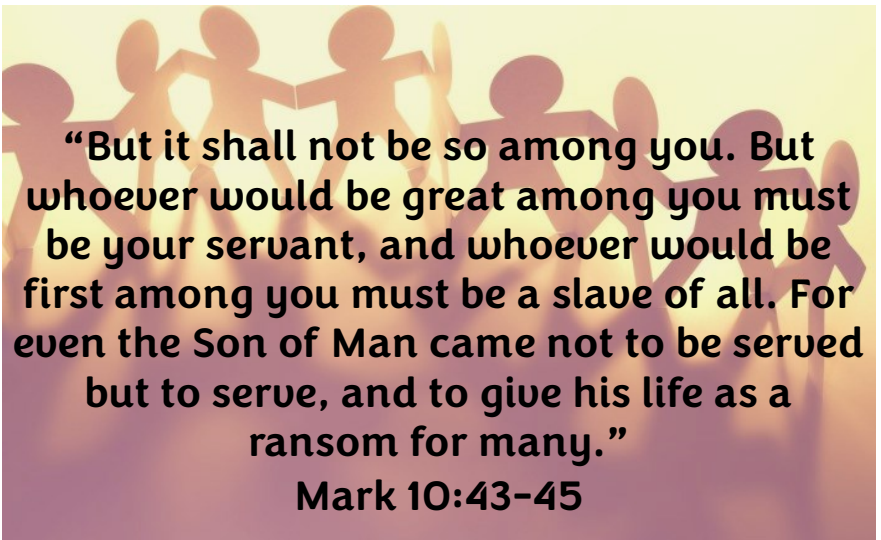
That some come to our fellowship activities. That they in time learn about Jesus and the Holy Spirit works in their lives and the lives of their families. This is my prayer.

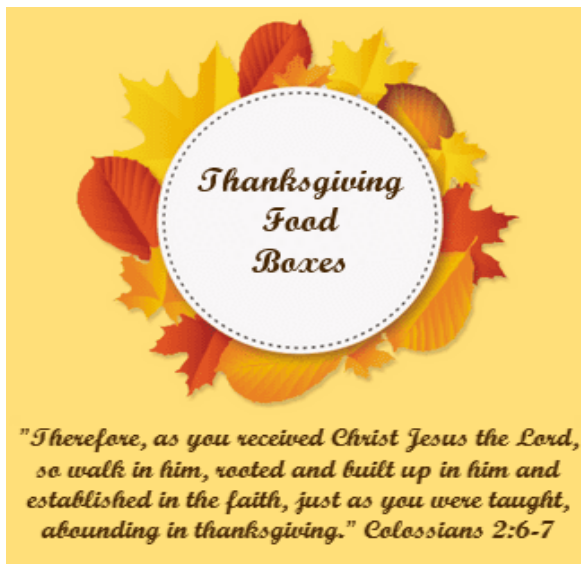

2023 ENGLISH BIBLE CAMP—CZECH REPUBLIC

Partnering with a Czech Lutheran congregation, you will put on an English Bible Camp specifically for elementary and middle school aged children in the community. This week-long event is similar to a VBS in the United States. Your team will be in charge of planning the English Bible Camp using the curriculum we provide. You will work with local church members to share the Gospel with the children that attend. The curriculum incorporates the Bible lessons with the English lessons. The English learning is informal- not as it is taught in school. It offers the kids the opportunity to put into practice the English that they already know.

A typical day lasts from 9:00 am – 3:00 pm. During this time, your team is in charge of leading an opening, English time, Bible lesson, craft, sports/games, and music. At the end of the week, there is a time for parents to come see what their children have been learning. This provides another opportunity to witness to those in the community and help in connecting them to the local Lutheran church.

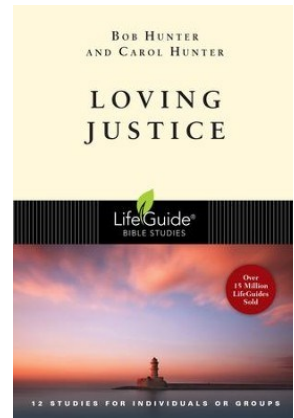

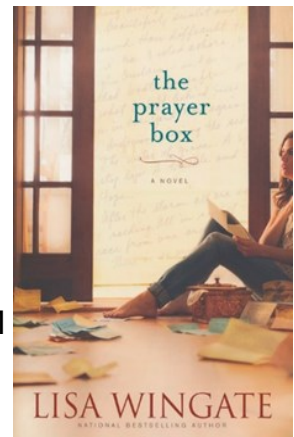

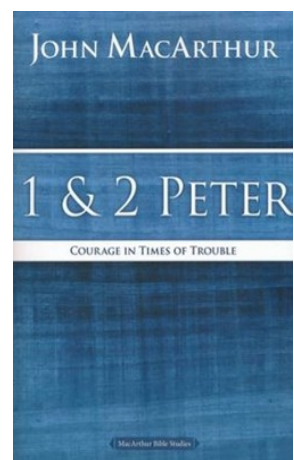
