Dear friends in Christ,

We live in a society and culture that puts so much emphasis on winning, success, and accomplishment, that we as Christians have forgotten God's goals for our lives. In politics it's all about power and money. In the workplace it's about surviving in ways that often seem to require taking advantage of others. In school it's about being in the "right" group. The world places demands upon us that are contrary to the way we are called to live as believers in Christ. What He wants to accomplish through us is entirely different and in stark contrast to the goals and desires of the world. Remember what St. Paul writes: "Therefore I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God — this is your spiritual act of worship. Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is — his good, pleasing and perfect will." (Romans 12:1-2)

I hope the following stories, which may be very familiar to you, touch your heart and remind you of what it means to listen to Jesus, to "be Jesus," and encourage you to follow God's plans for serving others as a "living sacrifice" to His glory.

The first story reminds us of a God who defines progress and accomplishments in His own way, and challenges us to let go of our ways and to listen to God and to trust Him:

A man was sleeping at night in his cabin when suddenly his room filled with light and the Savior appeared. The Lord told the man he had work for him to do, and showed him a large rock in front of his cabin. The Lord explained the man was to push against the rock with all his might.

This the man did day after day. For many days he toiled from sun up to sun down, his shoulders set squarely against the cold massive surface of the unmoving rock, pushing it with all his might. Each night the man returned to his cabin sore, and worn out, feeling like his whole day had been spent in vain.

Seeing the man was showing signs of discouragement, Satan decided to enter the picture by placing thoughts into the man's weary mind: "You have been pushing against this rock for a long time and it hasn't budged. Why kill yourself over this? You are never going to move it." Thus giving the man the impression the task was impossible and that he was a failure. These troubled thoughts discouraged and disheartened the man.

"Why kill myself over this? I'll just put in my time, giving just the minimum effort and that will be good enough."

And, that is what he planned to do until one day he decided to make it a matter of prayer and take his thoughts to the Lord. "Lord" he said, "I have labored long and hard in your service, putting all my strength to do what you have asked. Yet, after all this time, I have not even been able to budge that rock. What is wrong? Why am I failing?"

The Lord responded compassionately, "My child, when I asked you to serve Me and you accepted, I told you your task was to push against the rock with all your strength, which you have done. NEVER ONCE did I mention to you that I expected you to move it. Your task was to push. And, now you have come to me with your strength spent, thinking you have failed. But, is that really so? Look at yourself. Your arms are strong and muscled, your back sinewy and brown, your hands are callused from constant pressure, and your legs have become massive and

hard. Through opposition you have grown much, and your abilities now surpass that which you used to have. Yet, you haven't moved the rock. Your calling was to be obedient, and to push, and to exercise your faith and trust in my wisdom. This you have done. I, my friend, will now move the rock."

At times, when we hear a word from God, we tend to use our own intellect to decipher what He wants, when actually what God wants is SIMPLE OBEDIENCE AND FAITH in Him.... By all means exercise the faith that moves mountains, but know it is still God who actually moves them.

The second story illustrates what happens when we "do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but are transformed by the renewing of your mind in Christ."

At a fund-raising dinner for a Brooklyn school that caters to learning-disabled children, the father of one child was expected to give a speech extolling the dedicated staff's work. Instead his opening remarks shocked the crowd of parents and teachers. He cried out: "My son goes to this school, which teaches everything God does is done with perfection. But where is the perfection in my son Shaya? My child cannot understand things as other children do. So tell me where is God's perfection?"

The audience, shocked by the man's anguished question, hushed. A few people coughed nervously as the father continued: "I believe that when God brings a child like this into the world, the perfection He seeks is in the way people react." The father then told about the afternoon he and Shaya walked past a park where some boys Shaya knew were playing baseball. Shaya asked, "Do you think they will let me play?"

The father knew his son was not at all athletic and most boys would not want him on their team. Nevertheless, Shaya's father understood that if his son were to be chosen to play it would give him a comfortable sense of belonging. So the father approached one of the boys in the field and asked if Shaya could play.

The boy looked around for guidance from his teammates. Receiving none, he took matters into his own hands. "We're losing by six runs, and the game is in the eighth inning," he told the father. "I guess he can be on our team and we'll try to put him up to bat in the ninth inning." Shaya's father was ecstatic as Shaya smiled broadly. A team member told Shaya to put on a glove and go out to play short center field.

In the bottom of the eighth inning, Shaya's team scored a few runs but was still behind by three. In the bottom of the ninth inning, Shaya's team scored again and now, with two outs and the bases loaded with the potential winning run on base, Shaya was up to bat.

Would the team actually take a chance on Shaya to bat home the winning run? Everyone knew it was all but impossible because Shaya didn't even know how to hold the bat properly, let alone hit a ball.

Yet, as Shaya stepped up to the plate, the pitcher moved in a few steps to lob the ball in softly so Shaya should at least be able to make contact. The first pitch came in and Shaya swung clumsily and missed. One of Shaya's teammates came up to Shaya so together they could hold the bat and face the pitcher.


I know our Choir and Bell Choir is looking for new members. Ralph Hughes is always looking for help at God Cares About You. We are also always


FROM THE BOARD OF YOUTH

August is the month that you can be thinking about joining one of our choirs, either the vocal choir or the handbell choir. Rehearsals will start in September, after Labor Day. Music is a vital part of our worship! Through music we offer up our thanks and praise to God and give Him all the glory and honor! Each one of you as a member of our congregation in the pew contributes to the music of our church. I love (and God loves) that Christ Lutheran is a singing congregation! I thank you immensely that you are willing to sing the hymns and liturgy with confidence each Sunday morning, offering to God your voices in worship.

Joining one of our choirs gives you the opportunity to extend that worship experience and use your musical gifts to provide special music during our services. Again the pitcher took a few more steps forward to toss the ball softly. As the pitch came in, Shaya and his teammate swung at the bat and together they hit a slow ground ball. The pitcher picked up the soft grounder and could easily have thrown the ball to the first baseman. Shaya would have been out and that would have ended the game. Instead, the pitcher took the ball and threw it on a high arc to right field, far beyond reach of the first baseman. Everyone started yelling, "Shaya, run to first! Run to first!"

Never in his life had Shaya run to first. So now he scampered down the baseline, wide-eyed and startled. By the time he reached first base, the right fielder had the ball. He could have thrown the ball to the second baseman who would tag out Shaya, still running. But the right fielder understood what the pitcher's intentions were, so he threw the ball high and far over the third baseman's head. Everyone yelled: "Run to second! Run to second!" Shaya ran towards second base as the runners ahead of him deliriously circled the bases towards home. Just as Shaya reached second base, the opposing shortstop ran to him, turned him in the direction of third base and shouted, "Run to third." As Shaya rounded third, the boys from both teams ran behind him screaming: "Shaya, run home!" Shaya ran home, stepped on home plate, and all 18 boys lifted him on their shoulders. They made Shaya their hero, as he had just hit a grand slam and won the game for his team.

"That day," said the father softly with tears now rolling down his face, "those 18 boys reached their level of God's perfection."

This story places a whole new definition on winning, success, and accomplishment. One contrary to the definition by which our society and culture lives, works, and operates. Some things to think about as we, in contrast and even opposition to the world, live, walk, and act by faith in our Lord Jesus Christ! Take the time to reflect, examine yourself, and push the rock!

August 4, 2019 – Eighth Sunday after Pentecost

Psalm 100; Ecclesiastes 1:2, 12-14; 2:24-26; Luke 12:13-21, “What’s In Your Wallet?” - Sermon Text: Luke 12:13-21 - Rev. James Elsner. “What’s in your wallet?” goes the TV commercial asking about how you manage your wealth. Jesus had something important to say about that. He cautions about a condition in human hearts – yes, even yours!

August 11, 2019 – Ninth Sunday after Pentecost

Psalm 33:12-22; Hebrews 11:1-16; Luke 12:22-40, “Anxious Hearts” - Sermon Text: Luke 12:34 - Rev. Shayne Jonker. “For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.” If your stuff is what you treasure, your heart will be devoted to these things and become your gods. Thus, our Lord graciously directs us away from our idols to Himself. For He alone is reliable and can deliver us from anxiety and fear.

August 18, 2019 – Tenth Sunday after Pentecost

Psalm 119:81-88; Luke 12:49-53, “A Special Baptism” - Sermon Text: Luke 12:49-53 - Rev. Paul Shoemaker. Psalm 50:1-15; Hebrews 12:4-24; Luke 13:22-30, “Where Are You Standing?” - Sermon Text: Hebrews 12:4-24 - Rev. Bill Mueller. The reading in Hebrews 12 is always a challenging section of God’s Word. Who enjoys struggles? Who even wants to hear that God allows various things in our life to “discipline” us? We thought God was loving! 
Stephen Ministers care for people who are:
