Dear friends,

I came across the following quote: **"The more this country struggles to free itself from religion (Christianity), the more we become entangled in the consequences."** Let me add: "The Christian Church needs to wake up! We all need to wake up! . . . we are fighting a battle! As long as we keep focusing on the wrong things, the battle will be lost."

I have spent a lot of time in reflection during the season of Lent. Though I am writing just before Palm Sunday, by the time you read this, we will most likely be in Holy Week or the season of Easter. It is easy to let go of the reflections of Lent in light of the resurrection of our Lord and the message of Hope it brings to our lives. However, we often fail to seek and make the changes needed in our lives which we discovered during the Lenten Season. Let me share my thoughts:

Most of humanity has continued, especially through recent years, to move away from God rather than toward God - culturally, socially, and even religiously. In our particular culture, attitudes and opinions have changed even within Christianity to the point that beliefs and lifestyles of Christians are barely distinguishable from those who are non-Christian.

This slow and subtle erosion has taken place because the focus of the Church and because the focus of Christians on God has become hazy and unclear. The distinction between the Kingdom of God and the Kingdom of the world has been blurred and the fence between them has fallen into disrepair. Again, God is no longer the primary focus in the lives of Christians and Churches. Let me share with you a few examples from real life:

Parents primarily bring children to churches to be baptized, not because they desire a relationship with Jesus for their child, but because of family pressure, because of tradition, because it's "the right thing to do." And they do so with no intention of raising their child to be active in the Christian faith.

The same thing happens, and the same attitudes are reflected with Sunday School, Confirmation and the like — the primary motivation, once again, is not a desire that their child develop and nurture a relationship with Jesus Christ, but rather because "it's good for them — it's time for them to go through this."

Young couples (and older ones) live together outside of marriage without viewing their actions as sinful — because everybody accepts it as normal — and the church, Christian parents, and Christian friends remain silent.

Television and entertainment (movies, music, etc.) in general have desensitized our moral standards and eroded our scriptural

base for values and decision making. Look at the “acceptable” standards for sexual innuendos, content, and violent acts today as compared to 60 years ago.

A woman dates a man who is separated (but not divorced) from his wife (and vice-versa), and we fail to see it as adultery — justifying the behavior as okay because he's getting a divorce anyway.

Christians view worship attendance as important, but not vital — if something more interesting, more appealing, or more “satisfying” replaces worship for a week or two — it's okay, God will understand.

We live in a world of denial — people deny that there is anything wrong with their lives. They don't sin, they just do wrong things once in a while. It's okay, God still loves me, therefore I can live as I please, even if it's not pleasing to Him. People deny the healing power of Jesus Christ and His forgiveness, because they do not see the illness that is slowly and insidiously destroying their souls. People deny that eternal salvation is more important than worldly happiness. People deny that God can make a difference in their lives because they are comfortable where they are. People really don't want Jesus to make a difference in their lives because that means changing, and: “Why change when there's nothing wrong with me and the way I am?”

The fence between the Kingdom of God and the Kingdom of the world has fallen into disrepair, because Christians have been straddling it with all of their weight for too many years. It is time for us to get off of the fence and to re-sharpen our focus on Christ-focused and Christ-centered living.

In 2 Chronicles 7:14, Solomon prays at the dedication of the temple: “If My people who are called by My name, will humble themselves and pray and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land.”

It is time for us as individuals, as families, as a congregation, as a nation, to face the truth of where we are truly at in our relationship with Jesus Christ. It is time to humble ourselves before God, submit to His Will, to Rededicate and Commit to Loving and Serving Him with our whole selves, our whole hearts, and our whole lives. It is time for us to quit straddling the fence and to decide in which kingdom we want to stand! Do we stand in the Kingdom of our Crucified and Risen Lord? Are we ready and willing to seek and follow His Will?

Our world, our culture, our nation, our society need the hope that Easter brings. In order to bring that hope we, as Christians, need to learn to stand in the right place. Are you ready to stand?

I am reminded of the words of Joshua: “Choose this day whom you will serve – but as for me and my house – We Will Serve The Lord!” We will continue to preach, teach, live, and share Christ Crucified and Risen! Prepare for Ascension Day (being sent). Prepare for Pentecost (being filled with the Holy Spirit) Prepare to join God where He calls us to live and serve!



From the Principal

Wow, some amazing things are happening. We are heading in the right direction, the direction of normal. We still have a long way to go, but with the warm weather, and Spring on the way, I can't help but be optimistic!

I was reading an article by Tim Elmore about how to actually put empathy to work. I know many are struggling mentally and emotionally from being isolated for so long, and in general from a heightened anxiety about what is happening in the world around us. In the article, Tim mentions that many people experience a phenomenon called "psychic numbing." Because we have too little time, too much exposure to needs, and become overwhelmed, we often don't act to help others. Studies found that if one person needed help, and another person was alone, they tended to help, whereas, if there were many people who needed help, or if there were many people around who could help, no one helped. Three secrets for putting empathy to work are to put a single face to a problem, act immediately to help, and imagine you're the only one who can do anything. It's a matter of learning how to take action, even if we feel insignificant. Even though we may feel insignificant, we are not. We have been called by the One True God, who has planned good works for us to do in advance, and equipped us to do them!

For though I am absent in body, yet I am with you in spirit, and I rejoice to see your morale and the firmness of your faith in Christ. Colossians 2:5

The apostle Paul had a lot of people for whom he cared. He had started many churches, and he came to care deeply for the new Christians. Sometimes he even referred to them as his children in the Lord. The people he cared about were always on his mind.

You may find that those who you care about are on your mind much more often with the COVID-19 pandemic in the back of your mind. You will pray for them and think about all that they need from God. God has enriched your life with people whom you care for.

What do you think Paul would have given for a cell phone? "Hello Timothy. I have been thinking about the Corinthians. Tell me how they are doing. Thank God we have telephones to use as caring tools. Our Stephen Ministers have been trained so that when schedules don't match with their care receivers, or even when there is a pandemic, they can still provide care via telephone to those who are going through difficult times. They provide telecare.

You can do this too. Use your telephone to call and care for those in your life, if restrictions don't let you visit. Think about those in our congregation who you haven't seen in weeks, and give them a caring call. Share God's love with them by listening to them, talking to them, and praying with them. Show them, like Paul, you are with them in spirit and care for them as a part of our family in the Lord. Build them up, and you too will say, *I rejoice to see your morale and the firmness of your faith in Christ.*






New Worship Schedule




