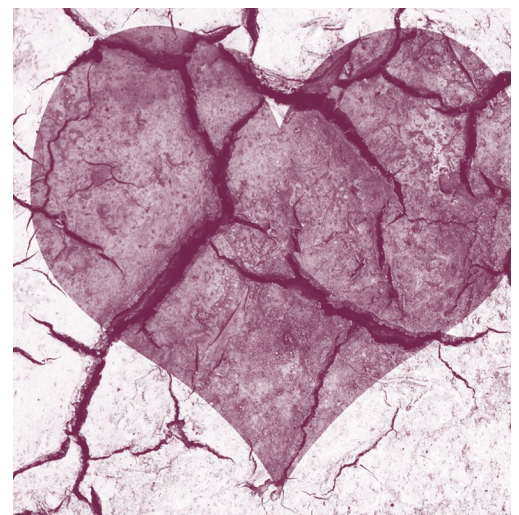

THE CAREGIVER'S COMPASS

As I was recently preparing for some training for our next group of Stephen Ministry Ministers and focusing on the Stephen Ministry's Caregiver Compass a light bulb went off in my head on what a great tool this is for anyone that loves Jesus and wants to serve others with His love. Thus, I decided this month would be a great time to share this with you as it has practical application to all in our church family, not just our Stephen Ministers.

The Caregiver's Compass is a guide to being the kind of Christian caregiver that God intends all of us to be. It is the focus of the Stephen Ministry but it is a guide for us all. I have a picture of it accompanying this article.

First, in the middle, are the Chi and Rho Greek symbols, an X and a P. They are the first two letters of the Greek word Christos, which means Christ. Since the early days of Christianity it has been the symbol for Jesus Christ.

It is in the center of the Caregiver's Compass because Jesus should be the center of all that we do in our caregiving efforts – really in all of our efforts. If we focus on the cross, if we seek and surrender to His will and not ours, Jesus will surely lead us in the right direction. As an aside, my problems have never been with God in the driver's seat, but on my own, I am not such a great driver.

The four points of the Compass point to four key characteristics of an effective care giver. I would take this a step further and say these are four wonderful characteristics of an effective Christian in other directions of service including outreach, mission, and working with others in our Christian community. These characteristics are to be:

- **Compassionate**
- **Full of Faith**
- **Skilled**
- **Trustworthy**

Let's briefly explore each of these characteristics.

To be compassionate – is to be willing to and able to share with other's feelings and journey, in good times and bad. It is to be willing to minister out of our own life experiences, to help others through loss or pain in life. It is to be passionate about what Jesus has done for us, and to bring Christ love and care to those around us.

To be full of faith – is to believe in Jesus and minister in His name. It is to express our faith in and love for Jesus and what He has done for us. It is to provide courage and love to those we encounter, and to Pray for those also, knowing that God can and will provide wholeness through Jesus Christ to those who allow it. It is to trust the Holy Spirit to actively draw others to Jesus.

To be skilled – is to use the tools that God has given us, through the teachings of the Bible, people of faith He has put on our journey, and resources He has given us to help mold us and grow us to be more Christlike in all that we do. To be skilled is also for us to seek training, Bible study, and Christian guidance to sharpen our listening skills, minds and bodies, to be of service to others through Christ's direction and the power of The Holy Spirit.

Our church season of Epiphany continues for most of the month of February. Because of the great love and abundant mercy God grants to us, we want to share those blessings with others. This month is also the time we take note of our own time, talents, and treasures and how we can use them to further His kingdom.

Sunday, February 5, we will emphasize the ministry we provide at Christ Lutheran School. The children from our school will be singing at the 11 a.m. service. This will be the conclusion of National Lutheran Schools Week. The theme for this year is "Making Disciples for Life," which is our goal as a Lutheran school. The theme is based on Matthew 28:18-20, and the song written for this year "To His Disciples, Jesus Said" is a paraphrase of this scripture passage.

We earned \$1,322.71 dollars of Fundraising money that went to these Distribution groups.
