Dear Friends in Christ,

Repetition is the mother of all learning. With that in mind, I want to repeat to all of you some of what I wrote a couple of months ago. In the midst of all that is or is not happening as the nCovid-19 pandemic continues to evolve, remember the words of Jesus:

"Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble." (Matthew 6:25-34)

We learn from these words of Jesus that our lives are in the hands of our loving heavenly Father who cares for us each and every day. We are not to worry over those things beyond our control and to remember that all things are in the hands of God. Rather, we are to seek the kingdom of God on a daily basis, hungering and thirsting for His righteousness which continue to sustain us as we live in the shadow of the cross and the glory of the empty tomb.

In the things we face each day, as difficult as it is, we put our hope and confidence in Christ. We take everything one day at a time, not worrying about what the next day will bring. Rather, we move forward knowing the future is in His domain.

I hear (and even I ask) the questions all the time: "When will we be able to do this, or resume that?, When will things be back to normal?" My answer is simple: "God knows." In the meantime we continue to live with a mind set focused on the Cross and the Empty Tomb. The Love of Jesus Christ continues to permeate our thoughts, shape our words, and motivate our actions. The Love of Jesus dwells in our hearts and gives us strength of purpose and a daily hope to lift us out of fear. The Love of Jesus guides our words and our actions as we continue to engage the world around us with the Gospel. We are still the Body of Christ and we are still called to be His people and to serve Him in what ever way possible by serving those around us. "Our Hope Is Built on Nothing Less than Jesus' Blood and Righteousness!"

Our mission to be God's people in this time and in this place still exists. Our ministry to one another and to the world around us still moves forward. As I write this article, we are worshiping in-person with guidelines in place. We will be starting a new school year on August 12th, students and teachers in classrooms, with proper precautions in place. Bible Studies continue, some online and some in-person. We are learning to adapt and work with "new" normal.

fall to raise money to pay the loan for our roof repairs and to give a bit of replenishment to our endowment funds. Some might argue this is a horrible time to begin a Capital Campaign in light of all the uncertainty in our world. I.E., How are you going to communicate clearly when it is difficult to meet with people face-toface? How can we do a Commitment Sunday or host a Celebration Event when so few would be able to attend? Are you crazy? You can't start a Capital Campaign in the midst of a pandemic with so much uncertainty!

I would however remind you once again of some of the very words from Matthew 6 with which I began: "Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?" or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself."

The blessings of God continue to rain down upon us. God's people have, through all that has happened, continued to support the ministry financially and faithfully. And so, in faith and hope we move forward in this Capital endeavor, trusting God to provide through His people. The loan (first year interest free) approved by the Congregation for the roof has allowed the repairs to commence. The School roof is already complete and work on the Church roof has begun! Prayerfully consider how you can contribute above and beyond your normal offerings over the next two years to support this Campaign. "God's Blessings Raining Down and God's People Looking Up!"

TWO NEW ROOFS!!


God willing by the time you read this the school roof will be completed and the church roof should be almost completed. Praise God!!





Weekly Scripture Readings & Sermon Summaries August 2020

August 2, 2020 - Ninth Sunday after Pentecost

Psalm 136:1-9; Isaiah 55:1-5; Matthew 14: 13-21, "More Than Enough" - Sermon Text: Matthew 13:20 - Rev. Thomas Eggold. Our Savior has compassion on the needy and has provided for the poor in miraculous ways. He has called us out of our poverty, exhaustion, anxiety, and doubt and has forgiven our sins. In Him, we have more than enough and now we can share His life-giving, life-changing, life-saving gifts with the world.

August 9, 2020 – Tenth Sunday after Pentecost

Psalm 18:1-6, 46; Job 38:4-18; Matthew 14:22-33, "The Powerful Word" - Sermon Text: Matthew 14:27 - Rev. Shayne Jonker. Fear is the underlying issue of this morning's Gospel reading. Fear threatens to swallow up Peter and the disciples in their little boat out on the rough sea. Fear paralyzes, it wears us down, it erodes our faith, and it generates doubt. To the disciples' fear, and to ours, Jesus speaks His Word: "Take heart. It is I. Do not be afraid."

August 16, 2020 – Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost

Psalm 67; Romans 11:1-2a, 13-15, 28-32; Matthew 15:21-28, "Perfect Healing" - Sermon Text: Matthew 1315:21-28 - Rev. Paul Shoemaker. We all pray for physical health to be restored when a loved one is ill. Our spiritual health has been restored by Jesus' death and resurrection. In Christ, whether in life or at death, we have perfect healing.

August 23, 2020 – Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost

Psalm 138; Isaiah 51:1-6; Matthew 16:13-20, "Built on the Rock" - Sermon Text: Matthew 16:13-20 - Rev. William Mueller. The question Jesus asks His disciples is rather simple: Who do people say that He is? However, Jesus' purpose in asking the question was far more than taking a poll of public opinion – He was narrowing it down to each individual person. Who do you say that Jesus is? Is He just a moderately powered helper, enough to help us over the speedbumps in life, OR is He the Lord God Himself who is our Savior?

August 30, 2020 – Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost

Psalm 26; Romans 12:9-21; Matthew 16:21-28, "The Way God Thinks" - Sermon Text: Matthew 16:23 - Rev. Dr. Thomas Ahlersmeyer. Are you ever tempted to be God's "script-writer," to tell God how to be God? Life's greatest news is this . . . God does NOT meet our expectations, He EXCEEDS them! This good news changes our lives now and eternally.

St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians that he went through many trying events. The list in 2 Corinthians 11:24-28 include beatings, lashes, being stoned, shipwrecked, imprisoned, and being accosted by bandits. He experienced hunger and thirst, danger on the sea, and the testimony of false brothers. He confessed to being burdened with worry about the churches. From his descriptions of trials and anxiety, Paul sure could have used a Stephen Minister!

Perhaps Paul had one. Luke might have filled the role of a Stephen Minister. He was a physician (Colossians 4:14) and ministered to Paul (2 Timothy 4:11). Paul says "Only Luke is with me." Being there, caring, praying together, and providing encouragement are some of the skills Stephen Ministers use with their care receivers.
