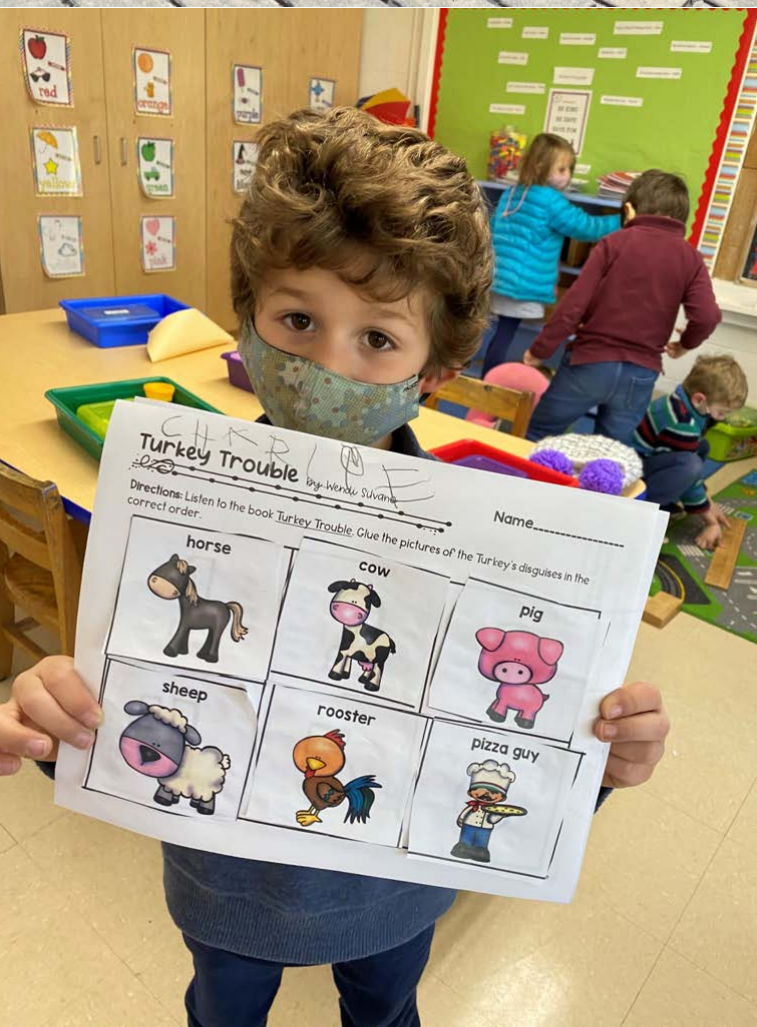


A Fly on the Wall...

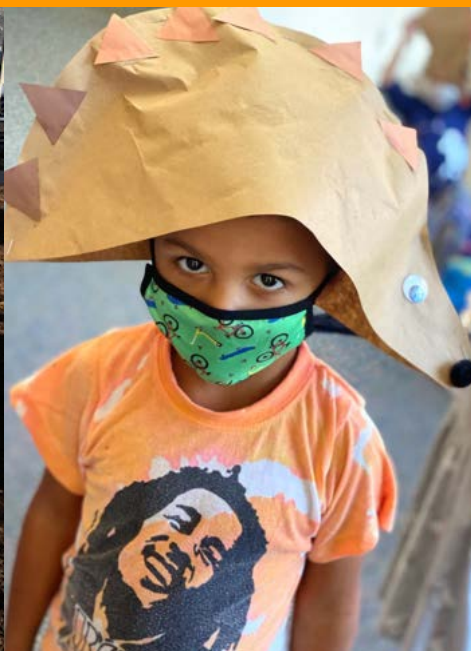

These are multiple letters together that make one sound such as -all in ball, -am in ham and -an in fan. In Math, we have been learning about odd and even numbers, (otherwise known as party partners), comparing numbers to determine if they are greater than, less than, or equal to another number and ten frames. We are now excited to jump right into the spirit of the holiday season.
