


A Fly on the Wall...


Mrs. Smith's Values


Mrs. Knott's World Cultures

The Pre-K classes had fun this week with magnets. We explored how the north and south poles of magnets can attract and repel, tested classroom objects to see if they were magnetic, and made snakes that we could "charm" with magnetic wands. Next week we will learn about nocturnal animals: how some have special eyes to see in the dark and play a game that demonstrates how mother bats find their babies using echolocation. Kindergarten is enjoying a Simple Machines unit. Last week we made pulley toys, and this week we made lever and fulcrum seesaws. Next week we will explore wheels and axles by building magnetic cars, and finish the unit using nails (wedge) and screws. Pre-first has started their Physics Unit. This week we explored sound, and how it is created by vibrations. The children all loved our noisy "chicken in a cup" experiment! We also investigated light and learned how to make rainbows using cds, crystals, and flashlights!
