


A Fly on the Wall...

The Pre-first children have begun learning all about the country we live in. We have been learning about different kinds of maps and what they can tell us. We know that a map is a flat representation and can tell us cardinal directions. We will focus on the 50 states, especially Maryland, and some important symbols that represent America such as the American flag, the bald eagle, the Statue of Liberty, and the Liberty Bell. We will also learn about where we belong on the map, beginning with the earth, then our country, our state, our town, our neighborhood, our school and our home. The pre-first children are excited to explore our country. In language arts, we will be learning about long vowels and magic e words. Our reading and writing continue to develop and get stronger every day. In Math, we are practicing telling time to the quarter, half and whole hour. We also have been practicing our skip counting skills by 2s, 5s and 10s. In May, we will spend some time writing stories that have a main character, setting, problem and solution. I look forward to reading the final stories from each student.



Enrichment with Mrs. Craig

We have been busy exploring flowers this week! Pre-K observed, then painted live flowers in vases. The next day we took those same flowers and dissected them to learn about their parts and functions. Kindergarten and Pre-First learned how stems act as straws by observing what happened to white daisies when we added food coloring to their water. They also tried to extract the color pigments from other flowers by hammering them between sheets of paper. The 3s classes made beautiful watercolor butterflies that we turned into wing flapping puppets and also explored making prints with markers and foam plates.

WOW - That is our 'W" word for all the amazing things that have been happening in Pre-K! We are working our way through the letter W this week with whales, weather, water, spring flowers that contain a hidden w and wondering how many seeds are in our watermelon slices! Over the past few weeks we mastered the letters U and V and we continue to review our numbers and work on one to one correspondence with counting. Last Thursday, we planted some seed bombs that the children made in science class. We will be trying to remember that every day is earth day! We continue to use our "outdoor" classroom as much as possible and love it when they find pinecones, dandelions, sticks and rocks to create new and messy things to play with. Apparently, the cicadas are coming....stay tuned. As we move towards the end of the year, we are excited to focus on all the growing and changing that takes place all around us. The life cycle of a butterfly and growing plants from a seed are wonderful visual units that the kids will enjoy. Hope to see some of you at the Pedal for Pediatrics ride. We are finishing this year so strong - and we thank you for all your support.
