

Scholars Shine at the YMWIC 14th Annual Science Expo & Scholar Presentations



On Saturday, February 15, 2025, YMWIC held our 14th Annual Science Expo & Scholar Presentations. Scholars from all nine chapters throughout the region came together on West Chester University of Pennsylvania's campus to present their Science Projects. Having started their projects in September 2024, Scholars have been eagerly awaiting this moment to describe the process and present their data and results to the judges for the chance to win first, second, or third place in their Scholar group.

For their projects, Scholars were tasked to complete background research, conduct an experiment, write a lab report based on their findings, and create a display board and PowerPoint slide show to present at the Expo. Scholars worked tirelessly over the last five months to produce really exciting presentations; it was remarkable watching it all come together.

After getting a few pictures of the Scholars in their formal YMWIC uniforms, the Scholars located their assigned rooms in West Chester University of PA's Main Hall where they presented their Science Projects to a judge and their peers. Once each Scholar presented, the groups took their display boards across campus to the Student Recreation Center where the Gallery Walk was set up. In the Gallery Walk, Scholars set up their display boards for parents, staff, volunteers, partners, and community members to see the amazing work they completed.

We finished our day after lunch by convening in the Asplundh Concert Hall for the awards ceremony. Before the announcements began, the YMWIC Choir performed several songs they've been practicing for the occasion, which was a delight. Scholars and families then listened to Mr. Rick Roberts, YMWIC Foundation President, as he talked about the day and called out the names of our winning Scholar presentations from the Future Stars (Grades 3-4), Plutos (Grades 5-6), Neptunes (Grades 7-8), Jupiters (Grades 9-10), and Saturns (Grades 11-12). Seniors in Grade 12 had more challenging criteria and judged accordingly. Each winning Scholar had the honor of summarizing their Science Project in front of the audience allowing all Scholars to learn and have a deeper understanding of what is required to earn a winning project.
