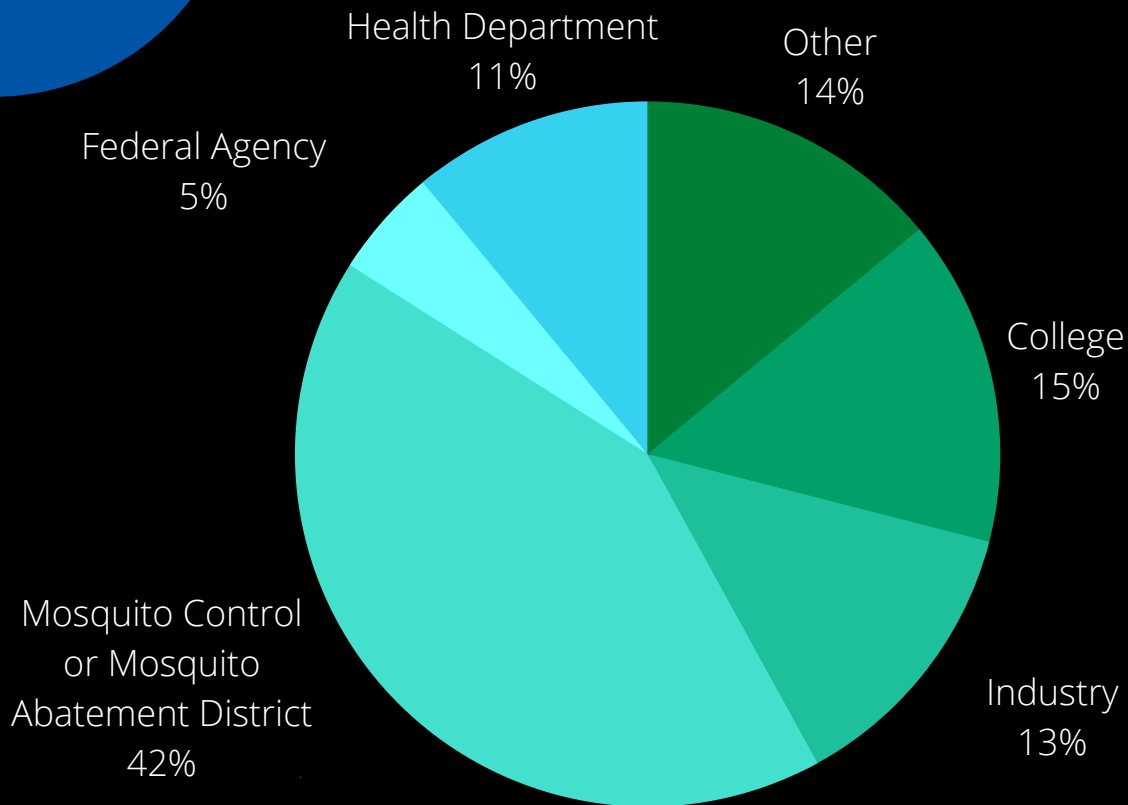

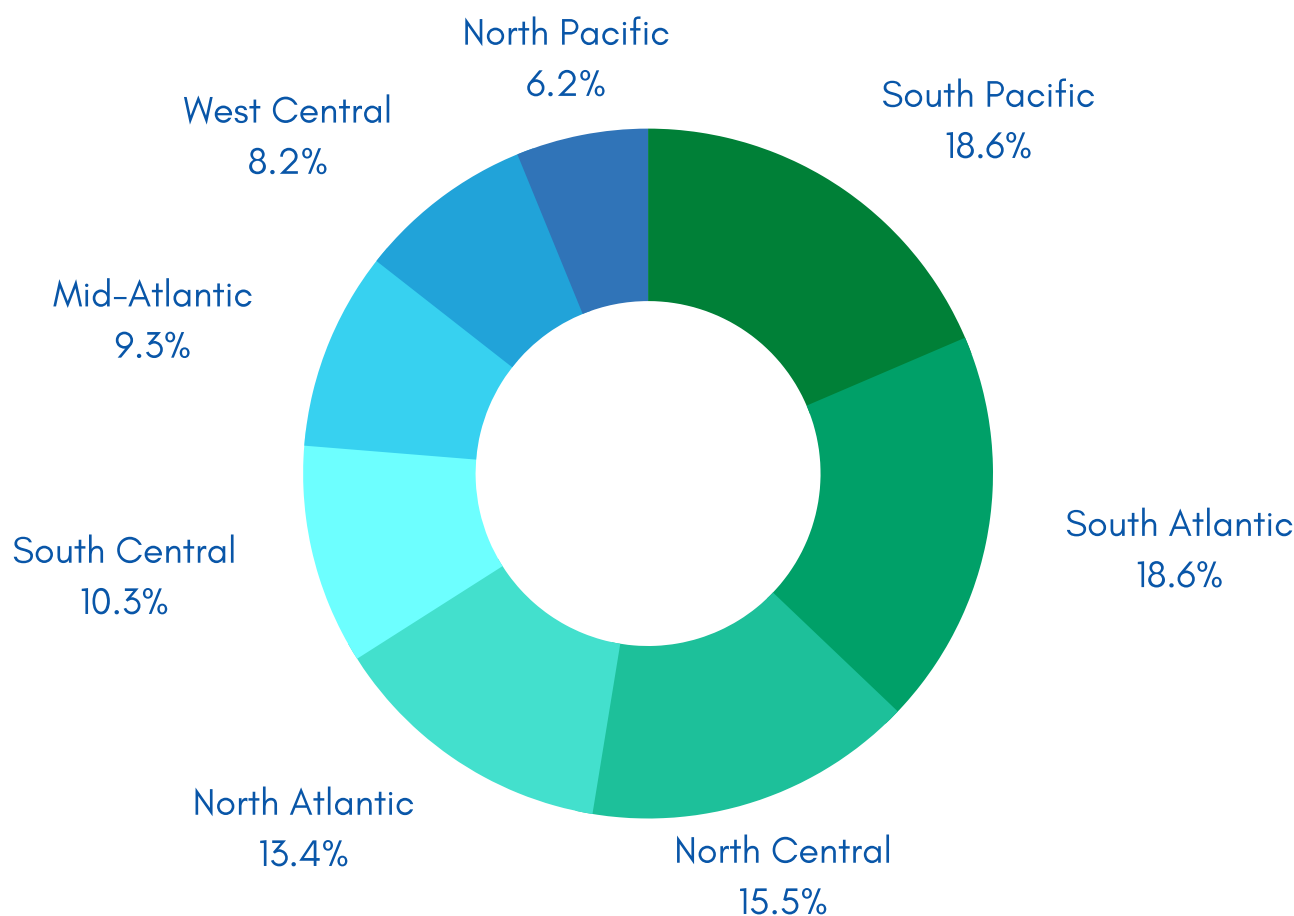

MEMBERS ARE DISTRIBUTED ACROSS THE COUNTRY



Survey shows 51% of respondents work in additional vectors beyond mosquitoes.



Ticks were reported as the top vector at 30%
Following top vectors respondents work in are rats, black flies, and fleas



The median member has worked in the field for 15 years.

MOST SIGNIFICANT IMPACT ON THE MOSQUITO CONTROL INDUSTRY:

- Lack of public understanding/support of mosquito control
- New and re-emerging vector-borne diseases
- Mosquito resistance to pesticide



Half of the top ten significant impact issues are related to communication and advocacy issues.

MOST CRITICAL PRIORITIES IN YOUR WORK:

- Increase and improve public outreach
- Improve my leadership, management, and administrative skills
 - *Over three-fourths (76%) of respondents under age 35 want to improve their leadership, management, and administration skills.*
