## Isla Vista Youth Projects Guidelines for Excluding Children & Staff with Illness

Symptom/Diagnosis	When Child/Staff will be excluded? (sent home or asked to stay home)	When Child/Staff May Return?	School Communication
1. Has COVID-19 Symptoms:  Fever (100.4 or above) or chills  Cough  Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing  Fatigue  Muscle or body aches  Headache  New loss of taste or smell  Sore throat  Congestion or runny nose  Nausea or vomiting  Diarrhea	Immediately	At least 10 days have passed since symptom onset. AND At least 24 hours have passed since resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications; AND Other symptoms have improved; OR  A healthcare provider has provided documentation that the symptoms are typical of their underlying chronic condition (e.g., allergies or asthma), OR A healthcare provider has confirmed an alternative named diagnosis (e.g., Streptococcal pharyngitis, Coxsackie virus), OR They have a negative test for SARS-CoV-2.	
2. UNVACCINATED person has been in close contact with someone who has a confirmed case of COVID-19  A close contact is: Someone who was within 6 feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period.  An infected person can spread SARS-CoV-2 starting from 2 days before they have any symptoms (or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days before the positive specimen collection date).	Immediately upon learning child (or staff) has had contact  If symptomatic – see criteria for symptoms (number 1)	For close contacts who are asymptomatic, may discontinue self-quarantine under the following applicable conditions:  i. Quarantine can end after Day 10 from the date of last exposure without testing; OR  ii. FOR CHILDREN ONLY Quarantine for 10 Days; AND quarantine can end on Day 8 if a diagnostic specimen is collected on Day 6 or 7 from date of last exposure and test result is negative.  • To discontinue quarantine before the 14 Days from last known exposure; asymptomatic close contacts must:  i. Continue daily self-monitoring for symptoms through Day 14 from last known exposure; AND  ii. Follow all recommended non-pharmaceutical interventions (e.g., wearing a mask when around others, hand washing, avoiding crowds) through Day 14 from last known exposure; AND  iii. If any symptoms develop during this 14-day period, the exposed person must immediately isolate, get tested and contact their healthcare provider with any questions regarding their care.  iV. Any contacts that develop symptoms need to isolate and test and remain quarantined until symptoms are gone.	Consider school community notification of a known contact (no action needed if exposure did not occur in school)
3. <b>FULLY VACCINATED</b> person has been in close contact with someone who has a confirmed case of COVID-19	If asymptomatic – no quarantine  If symptomatic – see criteria for symptoms (number 1)	Refrain from quarantine and testing following a known exposure if asymptomatic.  Continue daily self-monitoring for symptoms through Day 14 from last known exposure.  Note: CDC recommends that vaccinated individuals get tested 3-5 days after exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 and wear a mask in public indoor settings for 14 days after exposure or until they receive a negative test result.	
4. Confirmed COVID-19 case  *** Regardless of vaccination status.	Immediately	May return to school once criteria for returning to school for those with symptoms is met. (see number 1)  Follow quarantine recommendations for close contacts listed above. (see number 2)	School community notification of a known case
Tests negative after symptoms resolve.		May return to school once they have met the criteria to return to school for those with symptoms. (see number 1)	Consider school community notification if prior awareness of testing

Chicken Pox	When lesions are noticed or present	When ALL lesions are dried and crusted Typically takes 6+ days	Consider school community notification of a known contact
Cold Symptoms  Runny or Stuffy Nose  Sneezing  Itchy or Watery eyes  See COVID-19 Symptoms	If accompanied by Fever	When exclusion criteria are resolved or with a doctor's note stating the child/staff is no longer contagious	
Diarrhea	See Covid-19 guidelines	See Covid-19 guidelines	
Diaper Rash	If sores are oozing and leak body fluid outside the diaper	When exclusion criteria are resolved	
Fever	See Covid-19 guidelines (>100.4)	See Covid-19 guidelines	
Hand, Foot & Mouth Syndrome	When lesions are noticed or present	When exclusion criteria are resolved Typically takes 6+ days	Consider school community notification of a known contact
Head Lice	When nits (eggs) nymphs (teenagers) or Adults are noticed or present	When exclusion criteria are resolved (meaning none are visible, present)	Consider school community notification of a known contact
Irritability	If irritability cannot be redirected and/or prevents child from being able to participate	When child is able to be redirected	
Itching	If itching is suspected to be caused by any of the following: Scabies, Impetigo, Ringworm or anything listed above	When exclusion criteria are resolved OR with a doctor's note stating the child is not contagious	
Lethargy	If lethargy prevents participation	When exclusion criteria are resolved	
Mouth Sores	When sores cause drooling	When exclusion criteria are resolved OR with a doctor's note stating the child is not contagious	
Pink Eye (Conjunctivitis) or Sty	When discharge is noticed     Pinkish/red swollen or irritated eyes	When exclusion criteria are resolved OR after 48 hours of antibiotic medicine OR at least 5 days of home isolation has passed and no visible sign of infection	
Rash	When unidentified rash is noticed and is accompanied by:  Behavior change Fever  Has oozing/open wound Child is unable to participate	When exclusion criteria are resolved or with a doctor's note stating the child is not contagious	
Strep Throat	If child has a positive strep culture	After at least 48 hours of antibiotic medicine	
Vomiting	On the 2 <sup>nd</sup> occurrence within 24 hours	After 24 hours of no further vomiting occurrences and no other symptoms
