DID YOU KNOW?

Epiphany, on January 6, is the official end of the 12 days of Christmas. Many Christians celebrate this day by remembering the journey of the Magi. The Magi found their way to Jesus by following a bright heavenly body, usually represented by a star. On Sunday, January 5, we observe Epiphany at Wellshire and each receive a star word to guide our year.

FAMILY/PARENTING RESOURCES, TOPIC: BAPTISM

On January 12 we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. In his own baptism, Jesus identified himself with sinners—yet God claimed him as a beloved Son, and sent the Holy Spirit to anoint him for service.

WHAT IS BAPTISM?

Baptism is the sign and seal of our adoption into Jesus Christ. As Paul wrote, through the gift of Baptism we are “dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus” (Romans 6:11).

WHY DO WE GET BAPTIZED?

Baptism is the bond of unity in Jesus Christ. When we are baptized, we are made one with Christ, with one another, and with the Church. When baptized, we are responding to God’s redeeming grace offered to all people.

WHO CAN BE BAPTIZED?

God’s redeeming grace is offered to all people. Both believers and their children are included in God’s covenant of love.

The baptism of our young children witnesses to the truth that God claims people in love even before they are able to respond in faith.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

In January, children will wonder at the baptism of Jesus, recognize that Jesus faced difficult choices and rejected temptation. They will then begin to learn about Jesus’ teachings with the beatitudes.
