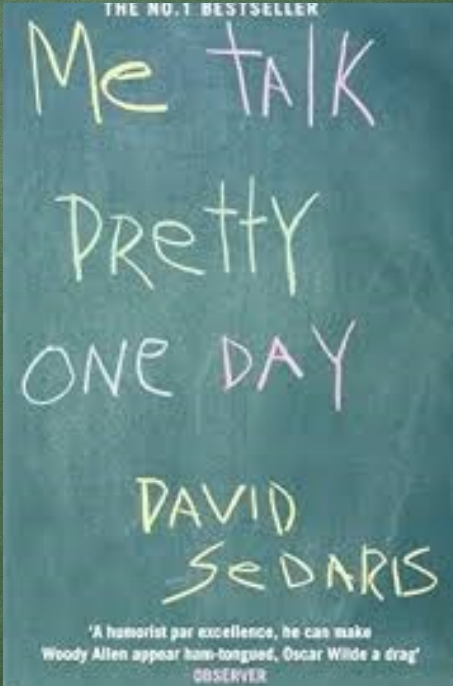

HUMORIST RECOUNTS MOVE TO FRANCE, LEARNING LANGUAGE

David Sedaris' collection of essays tells a most unconventional life story. It begins with a North Carolina childhood filled with speech-therapy classes and unwanted guitar lessons. Sedaris' career leads him to Paris, which poses a number of challenges, chief among them his inability to speak the language. Arriving a "spooky man-child" capable of communicating only through nouns, he undertakes language instruction that leads him ever deeper into cultural confusion. Whether describing the Easter bunny to puzzled classmates or watching a group of men play soccer with a cow, Sedaris brings a view and a voice like no other to every unforgettable encounter.

David Sedaris is a playwright and regular commentator on NPR. He is the author of the bestselling *Barrel Fever*, *Naked*, and *Holidays on Ice*. He travels though Europe and the U.S. on lecture tours and lives in France.
