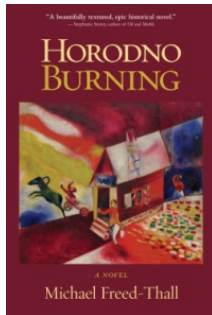


LUNCH & LEARN

Synagogue and the Islamic Society of Vermont established the first group in Vermont. OZ's **Vivien Brown** and **Nausheen Ozair** from the Islamic Society will share information and stories about the Burlington based group. "Before the pandemic, we would meet regularly at members' homes, discuss our faiths, our families, our lives, and many other topics and become friends," Vivien says.
