Fire up District 33! It is already March, with less than 120 days to complete our Toastmasters 2016-2017 term successfully! We are strategically positioned to accelerate all of our efforts in bringing about the transformation that we envisioned for our district this year!

Inspiration - I hope that everyone has started this calendar year in in high spirits to pursue your personal dreams while maximizing your Toastmasters journey. Our members have impressed me with many emails and phone calls with comments, suggestions and questions. I am truly inspired to see the incredible level of member engagement and participation in our district activities, despite many changes at the organizational level. As District leaders, we are obligated and committed to helping our members achieve their goals. As leaders, we are responsible for leading the district to success by achieving distinguished recognition!

At the beginning of this Toastmasters term, back in July, our District set a course to walk on stage in August at the Toastmasters Vancouver Convention as a "President's Distinguished" District. We are staying on track until we reach our destination. To come along for the ride, our magic numbers are 238 paid clubs, 8636 membership payments and 110 distinguished clubs. Let's inspire and empower our members to achieve their goals.

Transformation - Our district leaders are working hard everyday towards accomplishing our district mission. We are sharing our Toastmasters story—membership in the District, with more than 4300 to date, is growing day-by-day. My desire is to leave no club behind—and for every member and every club to be a part of our growing success. We have successfully rejuvenated and revitalized a few struggling clubs. Less than 2% (four) of our clubs are in the process of revitalization. Retention and sustainability of clubs can be challenging, but once the "know-how" is conquered, it is rewarding. We have chartered five new clubs so far with another five more on the verge of occurrence in the next two to three weeks. Our Division and Area Directors, along with our Club Growth Director, are also working on 15 more clubs which they expect to charter in the next three months. (Continued on page 2)

Members' educational achievements thus far this year are remarkable, which indicates that **transformation is occurring**. We have over 200 Competent Communicators; more than 100 Competent Leaders; greater than 120 Advanced Communicators; more than 65 Advanced Leaders and 17 Distinguished Toastmasters (DTMs).

Achievement – To grace the stage in Vancouver, the District has to achieve our magic numbers in all three categories of paid clubs, memberships and distinguished clubs! We have 10 divisions and 46 areas in District 33. The strategy to reach our goal is for every division to charter a minimum of two (2) clubs. Or, when 50% of our areas bring in at least one (1) new club, we are sure to achieve our mission. We need to believe in our strength and be persistent in the



pursuit of our destiny to become President's Distinguished. Remember, success does not require struggle. It can be effortless when you inject fun while pursuing your goals even when you're working incredibly hard.

I am asking and urging all members to get involved to help the District. Our number one rule is to retain our existing clubs and members as we work on our club growth. Some of the clubs in our District 33 family are struggling with 12 or fewer members. We have many district promotions and incentives in place to recognize and encourage members and clubs to continually grow and reach specific milestones. Each member, club and leader can contribute in several ways to the success of our District:

- Club Coach (help struggling clubs increase their memberships)
- Sponsor a new Club
- Mentor a new club
- Sponsor 5 new members
- Stay positive and supportive to your fellow members
- Give Constructive Feedback
- Be a part of the solution (there is always a solution)

When members succeed, so do their clubs.

To attract new members, clubs can hold an open house or conduct a Speechcraft program, which is a Toast-masters crash course in public speaking. The Speechcraft program helps new speakers experience the first five Competent Communicator speeches in a condensed four to eight week timeframe.

Success is all about consistency. Consistent hard work leads to success. Moving forward, focus your energy; believe in yourself to achieve big! Imagine what an incredible difference you can make in the history of District 33 by helping the district to reach a goal it has not earned in 40 years!





Would you like to know how to be more successful in your personal pursuit of excellence? Having high and focused expectations, along with goal-oriented

"stick-tuitiveness" are part of the answer.
