DISTRICT TRAINING JAN. - MAR. 2022



NEW DISTRICT TASK FORCE UPDATE

In November, a task force of 6 elders and 8 laity began meeting for the Charlottesville and Richmond districts to develop a plan for a new district. Dr. Lee presented preliminary recommendations of the task force to the VA Conference Cabinet on December 11, inspired by Matthew 9:14-17, New wine new wineskins:

1.WHY we are doing this – rationale for a new Bi-District (Charlottesville & Richmond): a connected district with a simplified structure to engage a new era.

2.New District Name recommended – Three Notch'd District: also called Three Chopt Road, this colonial route ran from Richmond to the Shenandoah Valley. Many thanks to those who submitted names for the new district!

3.STRUCTURE and tentative budget –

- Simplified Accountable Structure (SAS) for the new Bi-District reduce the number of committees from 20 to 2.
- Circuits organize the 139 churches into 14 Circuits of 8 to 12 churches, each led by a Circuit Elder.
- Budget consolidate administrative support across the Bi-District, and provide a stipend for Circuit Elders to cover additional travel and administrative expenses.

No decisions were made by Cabinet, but the recommendations were well received. Next step is to communicate the plan with the churches and pastors in the Charlottesville and Richmond districts for further input in the upcoming months.
