HISTORIC MOMENTS IN THE KING GEORGE VI & QUEEN ELIZABETH QIPCO STAKES

The King George VI and Queen Elizabeth QIPCO Stakes was first run almost 70 years ago in 1951. Since that time the race been established as Ascot's premier midsummer showpiece, attracting the very best middle-distance horses from across Europe to compete for this prestigious prize.

1970 NIJINSKY



One of the greatest King George winners of all was the legendary Nijinsky, an illustrious son of Northern Dancer handled by master trainer Vincent O'Brien and partnered by the peerless Lester Piggott.

Off the back of commanding Classic wins in the 2,000 Guineas and both the Epsom and Irish Derby, the colt was sent off as long odds-on favourite to add Ascot's mid-season highlight to a growing haul of Group 1 victories that July. Facing his elders for the first time, Nijinsky was the only three-year-old in an elite field of six that included Blakeney, the 1969 Derby winner.

He simply annihilated them. Poised towards the back of the field until the two furlong post, he soared effortlessly clear while still on the bridle to win by two lengths at a virtual canter, Piggott easing him up a half furlong out to leave Blakeney toiling in his wake. With an emphatic display of sheer brilliance, the rising superstar had become a true great.

Nijinsky famously went on to win the St Leger and thus claim the Triple Crown that September, a feat to have eluded every other horse to have attempted it in the fifty years since.

1971 MILL REEF

Another truly outstanding winner followed a year later. Trained by Ian Balding, Mill Reef was a diminutive American-bred colt who seemed destined for greatness following a brilliant juvenile campaign in 1970. On his second start as a three-year-old, he was upstaged in the 2,000 Guineas by Brigadier Gerard, another exceptional individual from what would prove to be a vintage crop of 1968.

Undeterred, Mill Reef went on to reign supreme over middle distances, clocking an imperious win in the Derby before breaking the track record at Sandown in the Coral-Eclipse. He lined up at Ascot later that month as the 8-13 favourite for the King George.

Travelling with conspicuous ease throughout, Mill Reef swept to the front inside the last two furlongs and sprinted clear to score by an authoritative six lengths from the Italian Derby winner Ortis, so much so that his jockey Geoff Lewis remarked that "daylight was second".

Mill Reef closed a near flawless season with a decisive win in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. His final race came the following June with a sixth successive Group 1 victory in the Coronation Cup, before a leg fracture sustained on the Kingsclere gallops forced him to retire to stud.



1975 GRUNDY



While only one could ultimately land the spoils, it took two horses to make this most memorable renewal of the King George, a race widely acknowledged across subsequent decades as ‘the race of the century’.

Bustino had won the 1974 St Leger before returning as a four-year-old to claim the Coronation Cup the following June. A year his junior was Grundy, who had amassed an impressive haul of Classic victories in the Irish 2,000 Guineas and the Derby at both Epsom and The Curragh before being sent off favourite at Ascot. Bustino’s pacemakers, Highest and Kinglet, set a blistering pace in a bid to test the dual Derby winner’s stamina.

Bustino and Joe Mercer took the lead as they started to swing for home, Grundy and Pat Eddery tracking their every move. Bustino was two lengths clear with two furlongs to race, but the younger horse was soon upsides and the pair locked horns in a titanic battle to the line. Grundy eventually got up in the dying strides to prevail by half a length, with two-time King George heroine Dahlia in third.

Both horses had given their all, smashing the course record - which stood for the next 35 years - in a gruelling encounter after which neither won again.

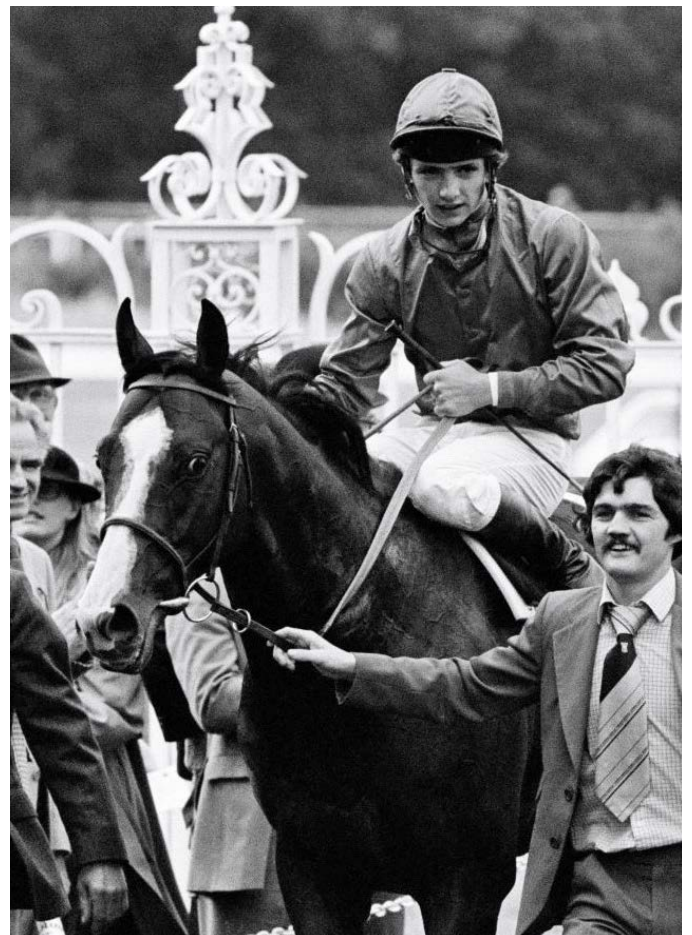
1981 SHERGAR

While it has been won by many great champions over the years, few winners of the King George have been quite as iconic as Shergar.

The Aga Khan’s prize colt arrived at Ascot as hot favourite to defy his elders after a sensational ten-length Derby victory in the hands of 19-year-old Walter Swinburn, which he followed up with ease in the Irish equivalent.

The King George field of 1981 set off at a slow gallop, with Shergar positioned handily on the rail behind the St Leger winner Light Cavalry. As they approached the home turn however, he became boxed in and remained so until Lester Piggott switched Light Cavalry wide. Swinburn seized the opportunity to guide his charge through the gap and the pair drew clear at the two furlong marker, going on to win emphatically, four lengths ahead of the French Oaks winner Madam Gay.

It was to be the first of six victories in the race for trainer Sir Michael Stoute and while Shergar’s name is inevitably remembered as much for his subsequent disappearance as his dazzling exploits on the track, his stunning performances that summer secured the place of this extraordinarily precocious talent among racing’s all-time greats.



1986 DANCING BRAVE



Dancing Brave, famed for dispatching his rivals with an explosive late acceleration, was the undisputed star of 1986. The 2,000 Guineas hero suffered a hampered run in the Derby and despite finishing with what would become his signature turn of foot, could not catch the winner Shahrastani in time.

However, he returned to winning ways with that same phenomenal speed in the Coral-Eclipse, and headed to Ascot as second favourite for the King George behind his Epsom conqueror, who had since claimed a second Derby at The Curragh.

Such was the quality of the race, that Royal Ascot winner Dihistan was deployed as pacemaker for Shahrastani and the improving four-year-old Shardari. Also lining up was the 1985 winner Petoski and the class French-trained mare Triptych.

Dancing Brave took it up a furlong and a half from home, quickening under Pat Eddery to take a commanding lead. The Derby winner was fading but Shardari fought back with a tenacious challenge in the closing stages. Dancing Brave responded, asserting his authority to hold on by three-quarters of a length.

Prince Khalid Abdullah's colt would go on to record a thrilling victory in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe that autumn and retire having won eight of his ten races.

1989 NASHWAN

Trained by Major Dick Hern and ridden by Willie Carson, Nashwan had enjoyed a faultless three-year-old season in the summer of 1989, comfortably winning the colts' Classics at both Newmarket and Epsom before landing the Coral-Eclipse.

His greatest test was to come in the King George two weeks later. Carson sat quietly in midfield until turning for home, when he began to give chase to Top Class, who had stormed into the lead as they raced towards the bend.

However, Cacoethes, travelling smoothly under Greville Starkey, was hot on his heels. The pair had crossed paths twice previously, Nashwan having won on both occasions including when beating Cacoethes into third in the Derby.

Nashwan took a narrow lead two furlongs out. His old rival soon joined him and they fought doggedly to the line, Cacoethes seemingly having the upper hand with every stride, only for Nashwan to bravely repel the challenge and claim victory by a neck, some seven lengths ahead of the third and 11 clear of subsequent Arc winner Carroll House in fifth.

It was to be his final and hardest-fought win and he remains the only horse to have won the 2,000 Guineas, Derby, Coral-Eclipse and King George in the same season.



2000 MONTJEU



Few King George winners have claimed the prestigious prize with such dominance as Montjeu, a son of Sadler's Wells who claimed the 50th renewal with almost alarming ease. The exceptional colt, owned by Michael Tabor and trained by the Chantilly-based John Hammond, had won the Irish and French Derby and the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe during an incredible three-year-old campaign in 1999.

He arrived at Ascot for his first and only run on British turf the following July after two effortless Group 1 victories earlier that term. He faced a field of just seven, which nevertheless included some highly-regarded contenders including Coronation Cup winner Daliapour and the progressive Fantastic Light, a subsequent six-time Group 1 winner.

Mick Kinane was treated to a self-confessed armchair ride on the favourite, poised motionlessly at the back of the field before easing a little closer approaching the home turn. Daliapour took the lead on the bend, but Montjeu was looming ominously and cruised up alongside him two furlongs out. It was game over. Montjeu sauntered clear with consummate ease, demonstrating his class to devastating effect.

The winning distance of a length and three-quarters over Fantastic Light fails to do the victory justice; Montjeu had dismissed his rivals with utter contempt.

2001 GALILEO

Fantastic Light went on to collect a hat-trick of overseas Group 1 victories before landing the 2001 Prince of Wales's Stakes.

Meanwhile, that year's Classic crop was being dominated by an Irish colt named Galileo, trained by a young Aidan O'Brien. Impeccably bred - by Sadler's Wells out of the Arc winner Urban Sea - he had maintained his unbeaten record to win both the Epsom and Irish Derby.

The pair's first clash in the King George was a mouthwatering prospect that attracted a stellar field in addition to the two main protagonists. Galileo set sail two furlongs out but was soon challenged by Fantastic Light, drawn wide under a patient ride by Frankie Dettori. Mick Kinane in turn asked Galileo to dig deep for the first time in the colt's career.

After a brief but compelling battle, he drew clear to win by two lengths, cementing his reputation as Europe's finest middle-distance performer while proving he possessed the courage to match his speed, stamina and class.

Fantastic Light would get his revenge, turning the tables on Galileo in the Irish Champion Stakes. O'Brien's first King George winner, Galileo has since become the dominant stallion of his era, siring a record number of Group 1 winners including the incomparable Frankel.



2010 HARBINGER



Of the unprecedented six King George winners saddled by Sir Michael Stoute, none was more impressive on the day than Harbinger.

Unraced as a juvenile, the colt progressed into a smart middle-distance performer at three and four, and following an eye-catching win in the 2010 Hardwicke Stakes at Royal Ascot, he returned to the Berkshire track to step up to Group 1 company in the King George. His regular partner Ryan Moore opted for Workforce - who had won that year's Derby for Stoute in record time - leaving Olivier Peslier to take the ride.

Harbinger stalked his Classic-winning stablemate throughout, who along with Irish Derby winner Cape Blanco, began to chase as the pair's pacemaker Confront dropped back with two furlongs remaining. However, Workforce faded tamely and Harbinger, still on the bridle, pulled clear to win by 11 lengths.

It was a breathtaking performance. He had destroyed a top-class field by the widest winning margin in the race's history, smashing Grundy's course record for good measure.

In a cruel twist of fate, injury curtailed Harbinger's career a fortnight later and while we will never know just how good he might have been, his scintillating victory resulted in him ending the year officially rated the best horse in the world.

2017 & 2019 ENABLE

The dual Oaks heroine Enable had taken a huge step up in class when facing the boys and her elders in the 2017 King George. She successfully saw off a top-class field, powering home in the driving rain to win by four and a half lengths.

A setback denied her the chance to reoppose a year later, but she memorably landed a second Arc along with a historic follow-up Breeders' Cup win that autumn.

Enable returned to training as a five-year-old, emulating her sire Nathaniel to win the Coral-Eclipse in July 2019. Three weeks later, in what has justly been billed a 'race for the ages', she became the first horse to regain her King George crown and only the third to have won the great race twice.

Drawing upon hidden reserves of stamina and resilience, Enable narrowly prevailed in an epic duel with the gallant Crystal Ocean, one which evoked memories of Grundy and Bustino.

Following a heartbreaking defeat in the Arc, the news that Prince Khalid Abdullah's outstanding mare would race on in 2020 was met with universal joy.

Her seasonal debut again came in the Coral-Eclipse; an encouraging performance behind the front-running Ghaiyyath delighted trainer John Gosden and her doting jockey Frankie Dettori, and should set her up for what would be an unprecedented third King George victory.



ENABLE'S HAT-TRICK BID



Enable is seeking to make history on Saturday, 25 July by becoming the first three-time winner of the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth QIPCO Stakes.

Khalid Abdullah's homebred mare currently shares the record of two wins in the mile and a half G1 contest with Dahlia (1973 & 1974) and Swain (1997 & 1998).

Like Enable, Dahlia had won the Irish Oaks prior to her first win in 1973, when she was the six-length winner under Australian jockey Bill Pyers at 10/1. Dahlia's owner -breeder Nelson Bunker Hunt had not been keen to run at Ascot but gave in to the urgings of trainer Maurice Zilber on the condition that if Dahlia lost, she would be removed from Zilber's stable.

A year later, the daughter of Vaguely Noble was the 15/8 favourite and partnered by Lester Piggott. She won in facile fashion, seeing off The Queen's Highclere by two and a half lengths to become the first dual King George winner.

In 1975, Dahlia attempted the hat-trick but it was not to be, as Grundy edged out Bustino by half a length in the race referred to as "The Race of the Century". Dahlia was far from disgraced though, finishing a further five lengths back in third.

Although kept in training in 1976, Dahlia was permanently transferred to Charlie Whittingham in the USA for her six-year-old campaign and never contested the King George again.

Godolphin's Swain was something of a shock 16/1 winner in 1997, coming home a length in front of Pilsudski under John Reid.

In 1998, Frankie Dettori took the ride on Swain and again the son of Nashwan came out on top by a length, this time defeating Derby winner High-Rise. Swain won his next start in the G1 Irish Champion Stakes and was then a gallant third in the Breeders' Cup Classic before being retired to stud.

Swain currently holds the record of being the oldest horse to win the King George. He was six for his second success in 1998 – the same age as Enable is now.

FRANKIE OUT TO JOIN LESTER

Frankie Dettori is set to partner the hat-trick chasing Enable in the 2020 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth QIPCO Stakes. The 49-year-old is the most successful current jockey in the prestigious contest with six victories and another win at Ascot on Saturday will make him the joint-most successful jockey of all-time in the race alongside Lester Piggott.

Dettori's six victories so far have come on Lammtarra (1995), Swain (1998), Daylami (1999), Doyen (2004) and Enable (2017, 2019).

Piggott triumphed on Meadow Court (1965), Aunt Edith (1966), Park Top (1969), Nijinsky (1970), Dahlia (1974), The Minstrel (1977) and Teenoso (1984).

GOSDEN & O'BRIEN BOTH CHASING KING GEORGE QUINTET

The entries for Saturday's contest are split between trainers Aidan O'Brien and John Gosden. Both handlers can boast four previous King George winners, with O'Brien enjoyed success with Galileo (2001), Dylan Thomas (2007), Duke Of Marmalade (2008) and Highland Reel (2016).

Gosden was first successful with Nathaniel (2011) and went on to win with Taghrooda (2014). Enable has provided the Newmarket-based handler with his two most recent victories in 2017 and 2019.

Sir Michael Stoute is the most successful King George trainer with six victories.

NIJINSKY'S KING GEORGE VI & QUEEN ELIZABETH STAKES WIN CELEBRATED 50 YEARS ON WITH QIPCO DIAMONDS & PEARLS AWARD



Each year, to mark QIPCO's sponsorship of the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Stakes, the winner of a vintage renewal is commemorated. To honour his illustrious achievements and victory in the race 50 years ago, Nijinsky became the latest recipient of the QIPCO Diamonds & Pearls award, won last year by Nashwan.

The son of Northern Dancer had already captured the 2000 Guineas, the Derby and the Irish Derby, and started at odds of 40-85 for Ascot's 1970 renewal. Nijinsky, the only three-year-old in the field, cruised past his rivals on the bridle and defeated the previous year's Derby winner, Blakeney, to win the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes by an effortless two lengths.

Owned by Charles W. Engelhard Jr., trained by Vincent O'Brien and partnered by jockey Lester Piggott, Nijinsky went on to win the St Leger, and in doing so, became the first racehorse in 35 years to win the Triple Crown. A feat which no colt has matched since.

Following his impressive racing career, Nijinsky went on to stand at stud in the US where he sired 155 Stakes/Group winners and remains the only sire to have the winner at the Kentucky and Epsom Derbies in the same year (1986 – Ferdinand & Shahrastani). His notable progeny include King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Stakes winners Ile de Bourbon (1978) and Lammtarra (1995).

Lester Piggott, retired jockey, said; "I am delighted to receive the QIPCO Diamonds and Pearls award.

"Nijinsky was a wonderful horse and was unbeaten at the time. There was a lot of hype going into the King George – the opposition was decent, they were good horses, every one of them had a chance. You had all the best – obviously we thought he would win. He came to the other horses in the straight so easily, it was hard to believe really but he won in a canter. It was a wonderful win and was probably the best performance of his career."

STAKES FACTS & FIGURES

History

Britain's top middle distance race for three-year-olds and older horses was first run in 1951.

The prestigious race was initiated to mark the 100th anniversary of the 1851 Great Exhibition at Crystal Palace and the 1951 Festival of Britain. In the first year, it was called the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Festival of Britain Stakes.

The incredible first running saw Supreme Court beat a terrific field that included the winner of the French Derby and Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Tantieme), Epsom Derby victor (Arctic Prince), French Derby and St Leger winner (Scratch II), 1,000 Guineas heroine (Belle Of All), 2,000 Guineas scorer (Ki Ming) and Washington International Stakes winner (Wilwyn). The first running of the race saw a new course record time as Supreme Court won in 2m 29.4s.

Sir Michael Stoute trained the first three horses in the 2009 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Stakes. Ryan Moore triumphed on Conduit ahead of fellow Ballymacoll Stud-owned colt and 2008 Derby runner-up, Tartan Bearer, with Coronation Cup winner Ask in third.

The Queen

The Queen has had one winner in the race named in honour of her parents. Aureole came home in front in 1954, while her French Oaks winner Highclere finished second in 1974.

Route to the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth QIPCO Stakes

Oaks: Pawneese (1976), Taghrooda (2014) and Enable (2017) landed the Oaks at Epsom Downs before going on to win at Ascot in the same season. Time Charter (1983) scored at Ascot the year after her success in the Oaks, with Enable's second success coming as a five-year-old in 2019. Dahlia recorded the first of her two wins in 1973 after capturing the Irish Oaks at the Curragh, as did Enable prior to her first win in 2017.

Derby: The 2001 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Stakes saw Galileo become the first Derby winner (and three-year-old) to win the Ascot contest since Lammtarra in 1995. In total, 13 colts have completed the Derby/King George double in the same year. Besides Galileo and Lammtarra, the other Derby heroes to have gone on to success at Ascot in the same season have been Generous (1991), Nashwan (1989), Reference Point (1987), Shergar (1981), Troy (1979), The Minstrel (1977), Grundy (1975), Mill Reef (1971), Nijinsky (1970), Pinza (1953) and Tulyar (1952). Additionally, two more Derby winners, Teenoso (1984) and Royal Palace (1968), were victorious at Ascot the year after winning at Epsom.

Irish Derby: 11 horses have collected the Irish Derby before also being victorious in the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth QIPCO Stakes in the same year - Alamshar (2003), Galileo (2001), St Jovite (1992), Generous (1991), Shergar (1981), Troy (1979), The Minstrel (1977), Grundy (1975), Nijinsky (1970), Meadow Court (1965) and Ragusa (1963). Additionally, four Irish Derby winners, Dylan Thomas (2007), Hurricane Run (2006), Montjeu (1999) and Ballymoss (1957), were successful the year after winning at the Curragh.

Hardwicke Stakes: The G2 Hardwicke Stakes at Royal Ascot is run over the same mile and a half course as the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth QIPCO Stakes. Five horses have completed the double - Harbinger (2010), Doyen (2004), Park Top (1969), Aggressor (1960) and Aureole (1954).

King Edward VII Stakes: The 2011 winner Nathaniel had been successful in the G2 King Edward VII Stakes, run over the same mile and a half for three-year-olds, at Royal Ascot. The other horse to complete this double in the same year was the first winner of the King George, Supreme Court, in 1951. Ela Mana Mou won the King Edward VII in 1979 before landing the King George in 1980.

Seasonal Debut: Golan (2002) won when making his first start of the campaign.
