IMPOWER offers a continuum of mental health and child well-being programs and remains fully operational throughout this crisis.

You can help in the following ways:

- Grocery Gift cards and emergency funds for food and basic needs at The Village, its transitional housing program for homeless youth (more than 75% of The Village youth have lost employment and income).
- Board games, movies, video games and sports equipment to help teens dealing with addiction at The Grove stay active and focused on treatment and recovery.
- Additional PPE needed, specifically masks for the residential programs and "essential" staff still having to work in the field.
