Reading Introduction

Jeremiah accuses God of forcing him into a ministry that brings him only contempt and persecution. Yet Jeremiah is confident that God will be a strong protector against his enemies and commits his life into God's hands.

Lenny Duncan is pastor of Jehu's Table in Brooklyn, an ELCA congregation. I will host a weekly one-hour Zoom gathering on Wednesdays at noon beginning June 17. If you are working, hopefully you can join us on your lunch hour. The book is available on Amazon for about \$13: in paperback, Kindle or Audible. If you need assistance in purchasing the book, please call me and I will get one for you. I don't expect these to be comfortable conversations, but I could not think of any group of people I would rather have them with. We are called to love each other as Christ loves us; I want to be open to learn how to do that better. I must, and can, do better.

MISSION OUTREACH for the month of June is Yavapai CASA for Kids. Yavapai CASA for Kids is a non-profit organization, that is set up to serve the unmet needs of children who are in the foster care system and to support the work of the CASA volunteers. Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) volunteers act as the "eyes and ears" of the Juvenile Court and help determine whether abused, neglected or abandoned children can be reunited with their families, be placed in adoptive home, or assisted into independent living.

While you are here, pick up the latest Christ In Our Home devotional, we have put them in a bin right by the front door.

Even if you aren't available on a Thursday (during prep) or Friday (during the meal), check with Outreach to see how you can help! With Trinity no longer doing meals and St. Germaine's postponing their meals during this pandemic time, Emmanuel will be hosting a second meal each month. Our next meal is <u>Friday</u>, <u>June 26</u>, <u>at 11:00 a.m.</u> We will be doing this meal as a take-out only. Community members who have attended in the past will be called and notified.
