MECHIRAT CHAMETZ

APPOINTMENT OF AGENT FOR THE SALE OF CHAMETZ

If possible, all chametz - leavened foods which are prohibited during Passover: wheat, barley, oats, spelt, and rye that has been allowed to leaven, plus rice, millet, corn, and legumes (Ashkenazi custom) or materials containing such food - should be destroyed or given away before the holiday begins. Should this be impossible, the chametz may be stored in such a way that we are sure not to use it during the holiday and its actual ownership is transferred to a non-Jew until the holiday ends.*

It is customary to make a donation for Maot Chittim - literally 'wheat money' - so that those without means will be able to prepare for the holiday.

I, the undersigned, fully empower and permit Rabbi Carolyn Braun to act on my behalf to sell all chametz possessed by me - knowingly or unknowingly - as defined by Torah and rabbinic law, and to lease all places wherin chametz owned by me may be found. This transaction will be in effect from 10:30am Wednesday, April 8, 2020 and for the duration of Pesach, which this year begins with sundown (6:59pm) on April 8 and runs through 8:11pm on April 16, 2020.
