BACHELOR'S DEGREE	\$1,000/ACADEMIC YEAR IN 1 <sup>ST</sup> YEAR OF ELIGIBILITY INCREASES BY \$1,000/YEAR FOR REPEAT RECIPIENTS WITH A MAXIMUM OF 3 YEARS OF ELIGIBILITY
ASSOCIATE'S DEGREE OR CERTIFICATE PROGRAM	\$500/ACADEMIC YEAR IN 1 <sup>ST</sup> YEAR OF ELIGIBILITY INCREASES BY \$500/YEAR FOR REPEAT RECIPIENTS WITH A MAXIMUM OF 3 YEARS OF ELIGIBILITY

## FOR BACHELOR'S DEGREE STUDENTS

***Applicants must meet the following eligibility requirements:***

- Declared major must be Mining Engineering or a related field.<sup>1</sup>
- Must be classified as a sophomore, a junior, or a senior in their major.
- Must have an overall GPA of 3.4 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- Must be an Illinois resident at the time of application or have work experience in Illinois.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year applicants must have completed a work program in the mining industry.<sup>1</sup>  
Qualifying programs include internships, student research, and summer jobs.

***Applications<sup>2</sup> consist of the following:***

- Resume (1-page maximum) showing state of residency and mining-related work experience.
- Transcript (unofficial) showing declared major and overall GPA.

## FOR ASSOCIATE'S DEGREE AND CERTIFICATE PROGRAM STUDENTS

***Applicants must meet the following eligibility requirements:***

- Must be enrolled in an Illinois-based academic institution.
- Must have completed at least 1 semester in a mining related program.<sup>1</sup>
- Must have an overall GPA of 3.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- Transcript must reflect strong interest in mining or a related field.<sup>1</sup>

***Applications<sup>2</sup> consist of the following:***

- Unofficial transcript showing degree/certificate program enrolled in and overall GPA.
