All you would need to do is:

Reply to WSF Admin at [admin@worldsquash.org](mailto:admin@worldsquash.org) with a photo (16:9 or square (1:1) ratios wherever possible) showcasing a court in your country. The best photos will showcase the sport and show viewers that it is in your country (for example, in the attached images, the photos show something of the country, as well as the court). This will help us to keep consistent quality, while also looking good on the various social media platforms.

You should also send a brief description of the court, including the name (if applicable), location, year built (if a permanent court), an interesting fact about the court and/or a detail of the tournaments played on the court. If we have previously published a related story, we will also include a link to this in the post (see screenshot).

While the WSF has access to a number of photos and information about courts, no one understands the courts in your countries better than you, and we would be most grateful for your enthusiastic participation in highlighting the global nature of our sport.
