

Safety Guidance for Re-Opening & Maintaining Manufacturing Facilities During COVID-19

This collection of safety-related resources is intended to support Ohio manufacturers as they reopen facilities or continue essential operations during the COVID-19 outbreak. This guidance has not been issued by the OMA; it has been collected by the OMA from credible sources and public health authorities. This document is designed only as guidance and general reference for manufacturers. Overview

On April 27, 2020, Gov. Mike DeWine rolled out the initial steps of his plan to re-open Ohio's business community. He said manufacturers that are not already operating would be allowed to re-open Monday, May 4.

- The governor highlighted these five safety protocols for all businesses. Please note that the "responsible protocols" handout specifically states: "No mask, no work, no service, no exception." (These protocols apply to all businesses, regardless of whether they have been open or not, the governor said.)
- Gov. DeWine also shared <u>additional safety requirements that are specific to</u> <u>manufacturers</u>. (Again, these apply to all manufacturers, regardless of operation status during the stay-at-home order.)
