



There are Training \$ available for the Tourism Industry in BC for applications submitted by July 31 for training with a start date between Sept. 1 to Dec. 31, 2017.

Train your staff for less with the Canada-BC Job Grant!

The Canada-BC Job Grant (CJG) is an employer-driven, cost-sharing program that helps employers invest in training for their current or future employees. In most cases, the grant reimburses up to two-thirds of the cost of training an employee, to a maximum government contribution of \$10,000 per fiscal year for each employee trained.

New this year, employers may qualify for reimbursement of up to 100% of training costs, to a maximum government contribution of \$15,000 per employee trained, through the Canada-BC Job Grant Unemployed Stream. You must provide a job to an unemployed person upon completion of their training to qualify.

Eligible Training may include:

- Marketing, HR, Payroll & Accounting
- Social Media (Instagram, Twitter, LinkedIn, etc.) for business
- First Aid, Safety, Food Safe,
- Management and Leadership Courses

Eligible training costs may include:

- Tuition fees
- Mandatory student fees
- Examination fees
- Textbooks and other required materials
- Travel costs, under certain circumstances

To be eligible to receive reimbursement from the CJG, the training:

- Must be provided by an eligible third party training provider
- Cannot have started prior to the application being submitted
- Must not be longer than 52 weeks in duration
