#### What's New

- Back to in-person teams! 26 in-person & 4 virtual teams
- In-person events Student Management Training, Trade Show, Interview Night
- Elections completed by Week 3 for Student Management Training
- New vision, new look and new website including Company Program Headquarters
- Wages will be mandatory

Participate fully and be on camera if applicable




Notify JA and advisors of changes (contact info or participation)

#### Student policies

#### **Student Attendance:**

- Students must attend at least 80% of meetings.
- Actively engage and participate in each meeting
- Missing more than 3 meetings without an excused absence and/or not actively participating in the program while present may result in termination.

**Code of Conduct:** Students are expected to follow the **Student Participation Policies and Guidelines** during Company Program and related events.



## Registration

- > Students **cannot** participate in a program unless they are registered, and their name is on the advisor's list
- Only JA can make the decision to allow students into a program – this cannot be done at the advisor level
- ➤ If a student participates in a program without being registered into that program – it violates JA policy and poses a risk to JA and the sponsor/host of the program
