CELEBRATING 19 YEARS!

We're honored you're with us for the 19th annual International Film Festival. In 2024, our celebration of the best world cinema takes place September 3-8 with all screenings at the MV Film Center at the Tisbury Marketplace.

We've gathered narrative, documentary, and short films that demonstrate the power of film through unforgettable imagery, creative story-lines, and unique characters.

The fun kicks off Tuesday with back-to-back documentaries. First, the touching Bangladeshi film MIGHTY AFRIN, about a 12-year-old who leaves the only world she's ever known to escape flooding and reunite with a father she's never met. This moving coming-of-age story is followed by the Israeli and American film SABBATH QUEEN about the heir of 38 generations of rabbis who yearns for a radically different life.

Day 2 starts with an afternoon screening of CROSSING, about a Georgian woman's search for her long-lost, transgender niece in Istanbul. That night, laugh a little at JOKES & CIGARETTES, a Spanish love story about a musician turned comedian.

Day 3, the official Opening Night, starts with a gala tent party at Tisbury Marketplace from 5:30-7:00 pm. Festivalgoers can mingle, imbibe, and nibble delicious foods and sway to the sounds of the popular Eric Johnson jazz band. Enjoy generous scoops from Mad Martha's Ice Cream for dessert then it's off at 7:30 to see the French dark comedy LUCKY WINNERS about friends who win big at the lottery, but whose dream turns into a comic nightmare.

Friday, September 6, begins with Sundance Grand Jury prizewinner SUJO, from Mexico,

about a son who confronts his father's legacy as member of a cartel. Critics call it an optimistic, gravity-defying story.

Friday evening is reserved for that perennial crowd favorite: the SHORT FILM JURIED COMPETITION. Come view the finalists and learn which the judges chose as this year's best short.

Start your filmgoing Saturday, September 7, with the documentary AGENT OF HAPPINESS from Bhutan and later that the afternoon enjoy the Spanish drama THE QUIET MAID. In the evening, view a romantic Georgian comedy, GONDOLA, a touching love story told with no dialogue!

Sunday, the festival's final day, the first film is ADIOS BUENOS AIRES, a dramedy critics praise for how it captures a real-life event—the day the government froze every bank account in the country—and turns it into a touching story about beauty amidst struggle. Also that afternoon: the love story of BANEL & ADAMA, a new film from Senegal by a first-time director that IndieWire calls "a striking debut."

The incomparable French actress Isabelle Huppert brings our film festival to an exquisite close with SIDONIE IN JAPAN. Then it's off to the post-festival fun when moviegoers travel into downtown Vineyard Haven and enjoy food and music on the spacious outdoors patio of FISH MV.

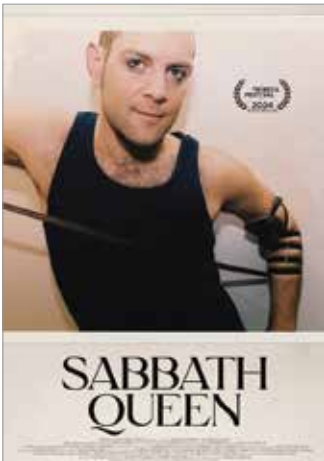

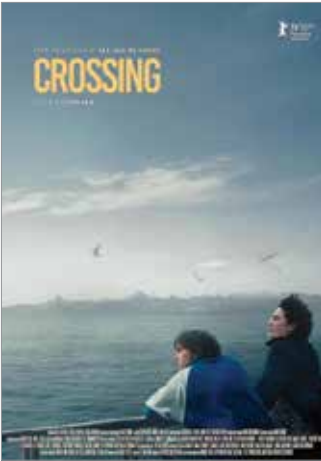

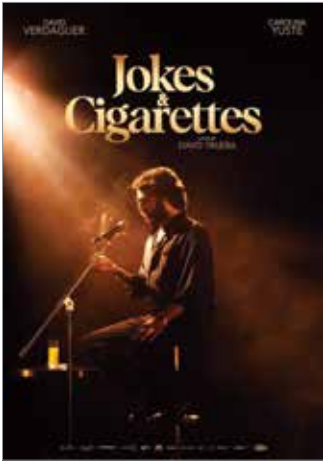

ADIOS BUENOS AIRES

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SAVIOR (3:51)
Director Ray Santisteban, United States
Featuring acclaimed Albuquerque, New Mexico, poet Marcial Delgado, “Savior” is call to action, a cry for help, and ultimately a harsh indictment of U.S. immigration policy. Part op-ed, part confrontational oratory, Delgado speaks his truth to a society that routinely vilifies immigrants.

MERMAN (14:35)
Director Madeleine Wynn, United Kingdom
Mari returns to her parents’ coastal home in rural England. There, through an unlikely acquaintance, she discovers the medieval legend of the Merman.

The truth behind this seemingly innocent myth is darker than Mari could imagine. Are those who are “other” destined to suffer as the Merman did hundreds of years ago? The message the myth bears across the centuries restores her resolve.

Having been struck with grief and loss, a legendary Jazz piano player retreats into an austere existence where he spends his days making music for his sick father and tuning the pianos of those who don’t truly appreciate the instrument. On this one day, Piano Man encounters Rosie, a saxophonist he used to play with back in the day. She’d thought Piano Man was dead; now, Rosie persuades him to return to the stage one more time.

Bhutan / 2024 / 94 mins / Documentary
This award-winning documentary follows two happiness agents as they travel the Bhutanese Himalayas, surveying citizens to see if they are happy. Each encounter reveals a complex mosaic of profiles within Bhutan. The two agents discover what happiness means to the people of Bhutan and what it means for themselves. The Guardian calls it a “slow-burning portrait that’s infused with warmth.” Nominated for the Grand Jury Prize at this year’s Sundance Film Festival,

winner for Best Documentary Feature at the San Francisco International Film Festival.
THE QUIET MAID

Spain / 2024 / 94 mins / Drama
A Colombian maid starts working at a luxurious mansion in Costa Brava for a family of art collectors. With hopes of a continued contract beyond the summer, she works from dawn to dusk. When she learns there is no chance of an extended contract; she decides to broaden her horizons and enjoy the summer. Screendaily says the film “combines a distinctive tone and striking visual sense with a knock-out performance from Paula Grimaldo.” Premiered at the Berlin Film Festival.

In a remote village in Northern Senegal, Banal and Adama are in love, but each struggle with their expected duties. Adama must accept the role of chief despite not wanting the responsibility. Banal does not want children with economic hardship from drought and is tired of being relegated to female-designated roles. The couple must contend with the village's disapproval and possible supernatural repercussions. IndieWire says the film is “a striking debut that puts Sy on the map as a purveyor of deceptively gorgeous visions that show flimsy desires at the mercy of the social, and literal, weather.” Chosen as Senegal's 2024 Oscars submission for the best international feature.
