

This mid-year testing window gives us an opportunity to measure progress. Testing began yesterday and will run through next Friday. Parents sometimes ask what can be done to help their child with testing. There are three basic things that we ask families to do to help with testing- get plenty of sleep, eat a good breakfast, and keep it positive. Our goal for all students is to do better on this test than the last one. Progress reports will be sent home in February.

This award began as a way to recognize those in our school community who are devoted to our mission to make Christ known and loved to all. Nominees can be a staff member, donor, volunteer, parent, or anyone from our SEAS community. Nominations will be taken through Friday.

2025-2026 planning and tuition increases. How is tuition set? In the fall we look at where our enrollment is, the size of our upcoming graduating class, and estimate our kindergarten class. We look at the staff needed to provide a high quality Catholic education, anticipate needs such as replacing curriculum, and then come up with a preliminary total expense. In preparing an estimate on income we look for any outside grants and scholarships that may be available along with fundraising. The difference between expenses and income is made up by the parish. The Archdiocese recommends the parish investment be between 25-30% of overall expenses. For the last five years, the parish has invested an average of \$515,000 each year. It costs around \$9,500 to educate a student at SEAS.

The increase is more than I'd like, but it is necessary to help us meet the goals and requirements of the Archdiocese and the needs of the school. In addition to increased tuition, we are also looking at areas of the budget that can be trimmed or improved. More information will be coming in the eNews over the next few weeks.

The best way we can keep costs low is to grow enrollment. The more students we have, the more opportunities we have to evangelize them, the more income we generate and the lower costs can be. You are our best advertisement and I encourage you to follow us on Facebook and Instagram and share the good news about SEAS. Talk to neighbors and family members in the area and encourage them to check out our school.

As stated on the flyer on the next page, ***cost should not prevent anyone from attending SEAS.*** We are willing to work with families to ensure that their child has the opportunity to receive an excellent education, provided by loving and supportive staff, whose main goal is to make Jesus Christ known and loved to all.

Other Expenses

Registration Fee:

\$100.00 per child or \$200 family maximum. Fee does not apply towards tuition.

Technology Fee:

\$50 per student or \$100 family maximum. Fee does not apply towards tuition.

Fundraising Obligation:

\$500 Fundraising per family. Each family is required to meet a yearly fundraising obligation. There are fundraisers throughout the school year to help families fulfill this obligation.

Volunteer Hours:

10 Hours required per family or \$500. There are many options throughout the year, including lunch/recess duty, weekend mass greeter, and classroom helper.
