

### Who can report a complaint?

- Any citizen may report a disturbance. On duty police officers may not onsite an unruly gathering. You can remain refused or anonymous.

### Who may be cited for an Unruly Gathering?

- Persons in attendance of the party/event, the owner, occupant or tenant of the premises, or any sponsor(s). If you are a University of Arizona, and cited for 16-32 the Dean of Students will be notified.

### What will happen if I remove the Unruly Gathering Notice prior to 180 day period?

- Only a judge may authorize the removal of the Unruly Gathering Notice, even if the associated/responsible tenants move out the removal must be granted by a judge. Removal, defacement or concealment of a posted red tag notice will result in a minimum mandatory fine of \$100. The owner, occupant(s) or tenant(s) of the residence in violation are responsible for ensuring that the unruly gathering notice is not removed, defaced or concealed during the 180 day citation period.

### What happens if no one answers the door when officers respond?

- If the Unruly Gathering criterion has been met the premise will still be issued an Unruly Gathering Notice despite officers not having any contact with the occupants. The notice will be placed on the window.
