

Hunterdon Veterans To Be Honored At 4-H Fair August 21st

The Hunterdon County Veterans' Recognition Medal will be awarded to over fifty County Veterans, at the Hunterdon County 2019 4-H Fair Opening Ceremonies, on Wednesday August 21, at 4 pm, at the Roger K. Everitt Fairgrounds, South County Park, in Ringoes. The ceremony is open to the public.

Past Veterans' medal recipients and all other County Veterans are invited to attend the ceremony to join in the salute the 2019 recipients. The Hunterdon County Veterans Recognition Medal was commissioned by the Board of Chosen Freeholders in 2002. The design for the medal was created by John N. Hatzikalfas of Team Graphics, located in Flemington NJ. Mr. Hatzikalfas is a Hunterdon County resident and a Vietnam War Veteran.

The program begins at 3:30 pm, on August 21, on the Main Stage, with Dan ‘Dr. D” Torrone serving as the Master of Ceremonies and patriotic and enjoyable musical entertainment that honors the County’s Veterans.
