## **Hunterdon County Provides Listing of Monuments and Memorials In Time For Memorial Day**

In time for Memorial Day, the public will now be able to find an on-line listing of monuments and memorials that are located in communities across Hunterdon County honoring Veterans and those who lost their lives in service to the nation, Freeholder Board Deputy Director John E. Lanza has announced.

Lanza, the Freeholder Board's Veterans' liaison, reported at the May 21<sup>st</sup> Freeholder meeting, "Through the County's website, the public will be able to find, all in one place, a list of the twenty-seven commemorative sites we have so far identified.

From Frenchtown's Doughboy to Kingwood Township's Veterans Monument erected by Cub Scout Pack 251 in 1990, the sheer number of memorials in Hunterdon County's localities, reflecting our patriotism and appreciation and respect for those who have served and paid the ultimate price, is astounding."

Lanza stated, "I wish to extend my appreciation to all the Municipal Clerks and Veterans groups who assisted with this project in providing locations of memorials."

Lanza suggested, "This Memorial Day weekend, if you have the chance, I encourage you to take the time to visit one of the sites near your home. In fact, any time of the year is a good time to make a visit. We should never forget those who have helped to keep this nation free.

They did their duty, and it is our duty and responsibility to pay tribute and to remember the selfless acts of so many."
