

VIRTUAL Veterans' Recognition Medal Ceremony On Veteran's Day With Online Slideshow

November 11th at 11:15 am

Freeholder Board Deputy Director Susan J. Soloway has announced that the annual Hunterdon County Veterans' Recognition Medal Ceremony will take place this year virtually via the internet, on Veterans' Day, November 11th, at shortly after 11 am.

Soloway, the Board's Veterans liaison, stated, "The other Freeholders and I believe that by offering the ceremony virtually through the county website; it may extend the scope of viewership, as friends and relatives of medal recipients, wherever they reside, as well as other Veterans and members of the public will be able to view the program on any of their electronic devices.

Soloway added, "We believe that it is most fitting for the rescheduled Ceremony to be set for Veteran's Day, November 11th. It will begin shortly after the annual tolling of the Historic Courthouse bell at 11 am.

To ensure health safety for our Veterans and their families the recognition medals are being delivered door to door to Veterans who applied for the medal this year. I was honored to participate in the delivery of some of the medals."

The Historic Courthouse bell is tolled in honor of all Veterans, and in recognition of what was once called Armistice Day, commemorating the end of World War I, at the 11th hour, on the 11th day, of the 11th month.

The bell is tolled 21 times in recognition of the 21 gun salute that honors those in the military who have made the ultimate sacrifice for the nation.
