

## Hunterdon County's North Branch Library Expands Hours, Open Sundays' Starting In March

The Hunterdon County Library System will begin Sunday hours at the North County Branch Library on Sunday, March 3, 2019. The Library is located at 65 Halstead St. in Clinton.

Freeholder Board Director Suzanne Lagay, liaison to the Library Commission, said, "We applaud the decision to accommodate the request of Hunterdon County's residents. Being able to have access both days of the weekend will allow more residents to access all of the resources available to them at the Library. From free internet, kid's programs and movie rentals, there is something for everyone."

The Main Library located at 314 Route 12 in Raritan Township, is already open Sundays. The Sunday hours at both locations will be 1 to 5 pm during the school year (from Labor Day to mid-June) except for holidays.

Terry Edwards, North County Branch Manager, said "Residents in the northern part of the county have been requesting Sunday hours because many who come to the Library to study or use the Internet are able to do so only on the weekends. This enhancement of our hours will help members of our community make better use of their time and optimize the use of our lovely facility."

Jean Allured, Chairperson of the Hunterdon County Library Commission, said, "The Commission is thrilled to be able to offer Sunday Library services at the North County Branch for the first time in its history. This initiative is a definite win for both the Hunterdon County community and the Library."

The Library is a place to meet, study and attend free events like concerts, films and workshops. Beyond books, DVDs and CDs, a treasure trove of other free services for children and adults are available – such as computer use, Wi-Fi, children's story times, in-house use of Ancestry Plus, book groups, and museum passes.
