LITURGICAL NOTE

Today, we hear a familiar story from Exodus in which Moses gives the people the Ten Commandments and establishes Israel as a community in a covenantal relationship. The Ten Commandments may also be found in the book of Deuteronomy.

WELCOME

GATHER IN THE LORD'S NAME

CHANT

The Lord is my song, No. 47; from Songs and Prayers from Taizé

The chant is repeated until the song leader stops the chant.

The Presider begins

Blessed be the God of our salvation.

People

Who bears our burdens and forgives our sins.

RECONCILIATION

Presider We come seeking forgiveness for all we have failed to be and do as members of Christ's body.

Silence

Presider God forgives and heals us.

All **We need your healing, merciful God: Give us true repentance. Some sins are plain to us, some sins escape us, some we cannot face. Forgive us and set us free to serve you.**

Presider God forgives you. Forgive others; forgive yourself.

KYRIE

The Kyrie is sung twice, taking the appropriate ending.



The Presider then says an opening prayer.

Let us pray. Eternal God, you call us into a covenant relationship: give us grace to withstand worldly temptations and pure hearts and minds to follow you. In Jesus' name. **AMEN.**

PROCLAIM AND RESPOND TO THE WORD OF GOD

Lessons are presented from the Hebrew Scriptures (Exodus 20: 1-17) and the Gospel (John 2: 13-22).

The congregation sings a tract between the two lessons.

A short sermon is offered, after which, a period of silence follows. The Presider then invites the people to affirm their faith as follows

All We believe in God the Father, from whom every family in the heaven and earth is named. We believe in God the Son, who lives in our hearts through faith, and fills us with his love. We believe in God the Holy Spirit, who strengthens us with power from on high. We believe in one God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

PRAY FOR THE WORLD AND THE CHURCH

With concerns for a world still enduring difficult times, let us pray to the God who makes all things new.

We pray for the church. May we trust and grow as we travel the deserts.

Silence

We pray for the world. May we come to live as one family.

Silence

We pray for this nation. May our leaders be wise and our lives peaceful and just.

Silence

We pray for those in need. May they have hope in their uncertainty and distress.

Silence

We pray for the sick. May your grace be present when we suffer.

Silence

We pray for the departed. May they ever grow in faith and love.

Silence

You may add your own intercessions and thanksgivings, either silently or aloud.

The Presider concludes

God of mercy, hear our prayers and make us new. Change our hearts and mend our lives for the sake of Jesus who came that all might have life and have it abundantly. **Amen.**

Presider Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

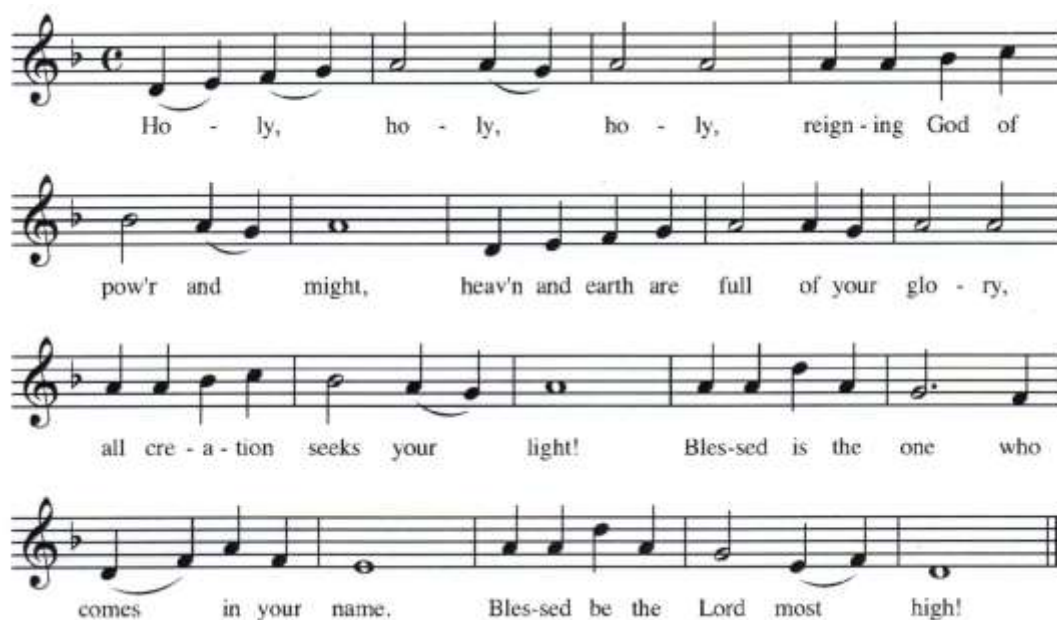
People **It is right to offer thanks and praise.**

The Presider continues

We give you thanks and praise, Almighty God, for the gift of a world full of wonder, and for our life which comes from you. By your power you sustain the universe.

You created us to love you with all our heart, and to love each other as ourselves, but we rebel against you by the evil that we do. In Jesus, your Son, you bring healing to our world and gather us into one great family. Therefore, with all who serve you on earth and in heaven, we praise your wonderful name, as we sing

The Presider continues

We give you thanks and praise, loving Father, because in sending Jesus, your Son, to us you showed us how much you love us. He cares for the poor and the hungry. He suffers with the sick and the rejected. Betrayed and forsaken, he did not strike back but overcame hatred with love. On the cross he defeated the power of sin and death. By raising him from the dead you show us the power of your love to bring new life to all your people.

On the night before he gave up his life for us, Jesus, at supper with his friends, took bread, gave thanks to you, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "Take this, all of you, and eat it: this is my body which is given for you." After supper, Jesus took the cup of wine, said the blessing, gave it to his friends, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and eternal covenant, which is shed for you and for many, so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me."

Gracious God, with this bread and wine we celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus, and we offer ourselves to you in him. Send your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts, that we may know the presence of Jesus in the breaking of bread, and share in the life of the family of your children.

Father, you call us to be your servants; fill us with the courage and love of Jesus, that all the world may gather in joy at the table of your kingdom. We sing your praise, almighty Father, through Jesus, our Lord, in the power of the Holy Spirit, now and for ever.

At the end of the prayer, all say

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, and the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

BREAK THE BREAD

The Presider breaks the consecrated bread. A period of silence is kept; then the Presider says

We break the bread to share in the body of Christ.
People We who are many are one body, for we all share in the one bread.

SHARE THE GIFTS OF GOD

Presider The Gifts of God for the People of God. Holy food for holy people.
Everyone consumes the bread together.

Presider Holy drink for holy people.
Everyone consumes the wine together.

Presider For those who are participating in a spiritual communion, let us pray.

People Gracious God, we love you above all things and are grateful that you are with us. Come spiritually into our hearts, unite our entire selves to you and never permit us to be separated from your presence. Amen.

After Communion, the Presider invites the people to join in this prayer

God of mercy, we thank you for feeding us in this sacramental meal. May we who share in these holy mysteries live together in unity and peace, in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.


