PROCLAIM AND RESPOND TO THE WORD OF GOD

A Lesson from the Gospels (Mark 1: 4-11) is presented and a short sermon is offered as a response.

After which, a period of silence follows. The Presider then invites the People to renew their baptismal vows as follows

Presider Do you believe in God the Father?

All **We believe in God the Father, from whom every family in the heaven and earth is named.**

Presider Do you believe in God the Son?

All **We believe in God the Son, who lives in our hearts through faith, and fills us with his love.**

Presider Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

All **We believe in God the Holy Spirit, who strengthens us with power from on high. We believe in one God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.**

Presider Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Presider Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Presider Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Presider Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Presider Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People **I will, with God's help.**

The Presider continues

It is indeed right, always and everywhere, to give thanks to you, the true and living God, through Jesus Christ. You are the source of life for all creation and you made us in your image.

When we sinned and turned away you called us back to yourself and gave your Son to take our human nature. In him, we see you, the eternal God, revealing your glory in our flesh, for he is the light of the nations who illuminates our darkness. Through him you send your Holy Spirit upon your church and make us your people. And so, we proclaim your glory, as we sing

The Presider continues

To you indeed be glory, Almighty God, because on the night before he died, your Son Jesus Christ took bread; when he had given you thanks, he broke it, gave it to his disciples and said: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me.

After supper he took the cup; when he had given you thanks, he gave it to them and said: This cup is the new covenant in my blood poured out for you; do this as often as you drink it to remember me. Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith

Christ has died, Christ is risen. Christ will come in glory.

The Presider continues

Therefore, loving God, recalling now Christ's death and resurrection, we ask you to accept this our sacrifice of praise. Send your Holy Spirit upon us and our celebration, that we may be fed with the body and blood of your Son and be filled with your life and your goodness. Strengthen us to do your work, and to be your body in the world. Unite us in Christ and give us your peace.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and forever. **Amen.**

At the end of the prayer, all say

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, and the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

BREAK THE BREAD

The Presider breaks the consecrated bread. A period of silence is kept; then the Presider says

We break the bread to share in the body of Christ.

People **We who are many are one body, for we all share in the one bread.**

SHARE THE GIFTS OF GOD

Presider The Gifts of God for the People of God. Holy food for holy people.

Everyone consumes the bread together.

Presider Holy drink for holy people.

Everyone consumes the wine together.

After Communion, the Presider invites the people to join in this prayer

Gracious God, in love we have been gathered as the family of Christ to share this bread and wine. May the flame of your love be kindled in our hearts that its light may guide us and shine on our work in the world. We pray in Jesus' name. Amen.
