

Hello White Bluff!

Our Advent Devotional for this season is "Brought to the Light" by Anna Grace Legband. If you have not already received a copy, it's not too late to start! We have copies in the church office and it is available in PDF format via a link through the church e-mail.

Recently, I gave a few thoughts about our "Brought to the Light" readings, and collectively about beginning the season of Advent. First, I love the idea that Advent is the beginning of the Christian new year! It's time to bust out those New Year's commitments, especially as it relates to re-energizing our relationship with Jesus. Time to get on it! Second, Bishop Oscar Romero once said, "Without poverty of spirit, there can be no abundance in God." The crazy thing about faith is that when we finally come to the end of ourselves, God is able to fill us up to overflowing and to make us whole... He does this through the Holy Spirit. Third, the very nature of blessing is emptying our lives out to make room for Him. Do you remember the Holiday Inn Express that Mary and Joseph were supposed to stay in? They ended up out back in the barn, because there was no room for them in the inn. Maybe that's precisely the point for us as well. When we can't get exactly what we want, then we become more available for Him to do something far greater than we could have ever imagined.

A few notable quotes from Day 2:

"...the Holy Spirit, God Himself, will do this."

"...you get to play a part, but this is a work only God can do."

"His plans are conceived in us, birthed through us, we are carriers and co-partners."

"Instead of becoming pregnant as a virgin and give birth to the Messiah, it may look like loving your (physically next-door) neighbor, giving to the point you feel it sacrificially, hosting strangers in your home, honoring colleagues at work, and a million other small but significant expressions of the kingdom."

"There's still room for questions, still room for fear— but she said yes."

In addition to the "Brought to the Light" devotional resource, there is an accompanying daily podcast called "The Wake Up Call" that you can click on and receive each day in your e-mail inbox. Does this sound difficult? It's easier than you might think! View and sign up for the podcast by going to wakeupcall.seedbed.com. You'll be glad you did!

The Advent devotional reminded us that Jesus is the Light of the World. Anna also stated, for some “this past year hasn’t felt like walking in darkness, but actually living in it. Disappointment, grief, unmet longings, despair, doubt, loneliness, depression, anxiety, and any other life experiences we’d rather not experience stand in stark contrast with the cheer and ribbons and sparkling lights that characterize December.”

As such, we will offer a Blue Christmas vespers service on Sunday, December 21 at 5 pm (5 is the correct time!) for anyone who would like to attend. It will be at the White Bluff sanctuary. A Blue Christmas service is a worship service, often held on or around the winter solstice, that provides a space for people experiencing grief, loss, or sadness during the holiday season. These services, also called "Longest Night" services, acknowledge and validate the pain and darkness people feel, offering comfort, community, and a reminder of hope found in faith. Services typically include prayers, reflections, quiet music, and candle lighting to represent grief and the hope of Christ. All are invited, and we would hope that you would invite a friend to come with you.

In addition, save the date for our December 24 @ 5 pm Christmas Eve Candlelight Communion. All are invited, and this will be an awesome opportunity for you to invite a friend to come to church with you! Christmas Eve and Easter are the two services a year where people are most likely to say yes to your invitation (80% of all people would say yes!), so what are you waiting for? Their hearts are open and they are just waiting for someone to step out and invite them. Pray for God to give you boldness and confidence, and take the leap of faith!

Don’t forget to sign up for the church-wide Christmas Party next Sunday night, December 7, at 5:30 pm. Bring your child/ grands to the Kid’s Christmas Party and Caroling on Sunday, December 14 from 9:30-3:30 pm (talk to Sarah McGalliard for more details on the Kid’s Party and Caroling and to sign up). This year’s WB Christmas Cantata will be Sunday, December 21 @ 9:30 am.

We have a lot going on, I am looking forward to journeying with you in this Advent season as we are all “Brought to the Light” of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!



CHILDREN'S MINISTRY



Week 1-Shepherds: Humble Witnesses to the Glory of God

- Main Idea: God reveals His love to those who listen.
- Overview: Just like the shepherds, God reveals His love to us when we take the time to listen. The shepherds were ordinary people doing their job when they heard the incredible news of Jesus' birth. This shows us that even in our ordinary lives, God can do extraordinary things. When we listen and trust in God, we can experience His love and joy, just like the shepherds did.
- Scriptures: Luke 2:8-20

Week 2-Wise Men: Earnest Seekers of the Divine Promise

- Main Idea: God guides those who earnestly seek Him.
- Overview: The Wise Men were guided by God as they earnestly sought the newborn king. Their story teaches us that when we genuinely search for God in our lives and ask Him to guide our steps, He will lead us right to Him. It's through this earnest seeking that we can experience the love of Jesus, and when we find Him, like the Wise Men, we will be filled with joy.
- Scriptures: Matthew 2:1-12

Week 3-Joseph: Steadfast Obedience in the Midst of Uncertainty


- Main Idea: God supports those who obey Him even when it's hard.
- Overview: Joseph's story shows us that God supports those who obey Him, even when it's challenging or doesn't make sense. Joseph trusted God's plan and followed His instructions, which led to him being a crucial part of Jesus' story. Similarly, when we obey God, we're saying we trust Him. It's through this trust that we can experience the love of Jesus and find joy, even in uncertain times.
- Scriptures: Matthew 1:18-24, Matthew 2:13-15

Week 4-Mary: Trusting God in the Midst of the Miraculous

- Main Idea: God blesses those who trust in Him, no matter how impossible things seem.
- Overview: Mary was just an ordinary girl, but her trust in God led her to be part of the most extraordinary event in history: the birth of Jesus. Her story teaches us that when we trust God, even when things seem impossible, we can experience His miraculous love. This trust opens us to the love of Jesus and brings joy into our lives.
- Scriptures: Luke 1:26-38, Luke 2:19

Week 5-Jesus: The Greatest Gift of God's Love

- Main Idea: Jesus is the greatest gift of God's love to us.
- Overview: Jesus' birth, the central event in the Nativity story, shows us that Jesus is the greatest gift of God's love. His coming to earth as a baby, growing up to die for our sins, demonstrates God's immense love for us. Through Jesus, we can experience forgiveness and form a deep relationship with Him. When we realize this gift, it brings us the greatest joy of all.
- Scriptures: Luke 2:1-7, John 3:16
