

Hello White Bluff! Happy New Year! As we enter this new year, I pray that 2026 may bring you continued success, growth, and happiness. Thank you for being a faithful member at White Bluff, and I look forward to serving you in the year ahead.

Let me begin by saying how grateful I was for such a great Christmas season. The church-wide Christmas party, the Sunday School parties, the choir cantata, the Blue Christmas service, and Christmas Eve worship with 250 in attendance were all such highlights of mine. Many thanks to all who worshipped God through song, the Word, and service during such a special season at White Bluff.

What will we focus on in 2026? I'm glad you asked!

First, we will continue with our emphasis on Spiritual Parenting. You may remember the worship videos from my conversation with Rich Wilson in December. Spiritual parenting is grounded in faithful discipleship—growing deeper as a disciple of Jesus in Christian community, but also being invitational as we realize that we are to make disciples of Jesus Christ who will spread Scriptural holiness across the globe.

Second, I am excited about our White Bluff prayer team. We will continue to develop our prayer ministries at White Bluff through prayer meetings, training session on prayer methods, retreats, and our continued text prayer chain. I look forward to working with Kristen, Melissa, Mina, Delilah, and the entire prayer team to continually deepen our understanding and love for prayer at White Bluff.

Third, yes, we are coming up to the season of Lent beginning Ash Wednesday, February 18, 2026. Our Lenten devotional resource will be J.D. Walt's "Jesus Asking: The Three Transformational Questions of Lent." We will make this resource available to you in large print again, as well as a PDF document via email. Schedule wise, mark your calendars now for the churchwide pancake dinner on Fat Tuesday (February 17), the drive-thru Ashing (February 18-11:30-12:30), Ash Wednesday pasta meal followed by worship (February 18), and Easter Sunday on April 5.

Fourth, we will continue to seek tangible ways we can work hand-in-hand with Grace in our ministry offerings. This may include (but not limited to) shared Senior Adult meetings and prayer meetings. I appreciate our connection to our sister church and the ways we are able to work together.

Beyond the activities, we will continue to focus on being the body of Christ where each and every person is important and has a role to play in building up the body. Being the body of Christ signifies we are connected to Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit, participating in Holy Spirit's work in our church and the world, extending the Holy Spirit's tangible presence in the world through oneness, mutual care for one another, and the shared purpose for making disciples of Jesus.

As we begin 2026, I want to leave you with one of my favorite passages, 1 Corinthians 12 (the whole chapter is awesome, but let's focus on v. 21-26):

²¹ The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!" ²² On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, ²³ and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor. And the parts that are unpresentable are treated with special modesty, ²⁴ while our presentable parts need no special treatment. But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it, ²⁵ so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. ²⁶ If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it.

My prayer for White Bluff is that we would seek after and remain one under the Lordship of the One and Only in 2026. I am honored to be your pastor.
