For the sake of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ, forgive us all our offenses; and grant that we may serve you in newness of life, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

of the Holy Spirit.

People Amen.

Officiant O God, make speed to save us.

People O Lord, make haste to help us. Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the

- ⁷ I will exult and rejoice in your steadfast love, because you have / seen my affliction; * you have taken heed of / my adversities,

- ⁹ Be gracious to me, O Lord, for / I am in distress; * my eye wastes away from grief, my soul and / body also.
- ¹⁰ For my life is spent with sorrow, and my / years with sighing; * my strength fails because of my misery, and / my bones waste away.
- ¹¹ I am the scorn of all my adversaries, a horror to my neighbors, an object of dread to / my acquaintances; *

those who see me / in the street flee from me.

- ¹² I have passed out of mind / like one who is dead; *
 - I have become like a / broken vessel.
- ¹³ For I hear the whispering of many: / terror all around! * as they scheme together against me, as they / plot to take my life.
- ¹⁴ But I / trust in you, O Lord; * I say, / "You are my God."
