Mental Health America of California (MHAC) is a statewide peer-run nonprofit serving people and agencies across California. Summary: Instructor position has responsibility for ensuring that students receive regular classroom instruction to prepare students to take the Statewide Peer Support Specialist Certification and to enhance their skills; as part of CAPS (California Association of Peer Supporters) ACADEMY, the statewide collaboration with MHAC, Mental Health Association of San

Francisco (MHA-SF) and Project Return Peer Support Network (PRPSN); and potentially travel to conferences and events to promote our agency and training institute.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

This is not an exhaustive list. Other duties may be assigned as deemed appropriate or necessary by the Director of Workforce and Education. Reasonable accommodation will be provided to any qualified person with a medical or psychiatric disability, providing it will not change the essential nature of the position, nor cause undue hardship to the Agency's operations. - Reports to Director of Workforce and Education.
- Ensures CAPS contractual requirements are met, students are up to date with trainings and all documents are up to date and correct.
- Required to work a modified schedule to ensure hybrid (onsite and/or virtual) classroom instruction to CAPS ACADEMY students. Cohorts of classes occur at a variety of times that include evenings, daytime, and occasional Saturday's.
- Collaborate with CAPS ACADEMY team.
- Execute evidence-based trainings focused on mental health, peer-oriented skill building practices, public health interventions, and CA's Peer Specialist Certification Program for the greater mental health community.
- Develop slides and handouts, implementation plans, event coordination, and evaluation activities.
- Must be available during classroom as scheduled to ensure the seamless delivery of the core competencies.
- Stay informed regarding applicable legislation effecting the Public Mental Health System (PMHS.).
- Promote the institute and agency in community meetings.
- Administer practice-tests to the students.
- Coordinate and facilitate student study groups.
- Provide hands on support and guidance to students through one-to-one meetings and student support groups through scheduled office hours and as needed when a situation arrives with a student.
- Provide constructive feedback to students to maximize their ability to succeed.
- Track student attendance and assignments.
- Attend weekly faculty meetings with CAPS ACADEMY team.
- Welcome, engage, build, and maintain rapport with trainees, employers, CAPS ACADEMY employees, members, etc.
- Exhibit good personal judgment, a non-bias attitude, sensitivity, and discretion when dealing with other individuals. Must demonstrate the skills and ability to "work and play well with others" interacting with co-workers, students, family members and community partners effectively and responding appropriately when experiencing interpersonal conflict with others.

- Communicate and articulate the mission of MHAC and CAPS ACADEMY and its services to a wide variety of audiences.
- Model MHAC and CAPS ACADEMY approach, mission and core values in all communication and correspondence.
- Other duties as assigned by the Director of Workforce and Education.

POSITION Qualifications and Skills:

- The position is reserved for an individual with lived experience of mental health challenge.
- High School diploma or GED required.
- Associates or bachelor's degree preferred, preferably in education, social service, or similar field or four years of experience that corresponds with the responsibilities of the job position.
- Must have teaching/training/service provider experience related to core recovery topics.
- Possess strong organizational skills, excellent communication skills, a passion for teaching utilizing core learning techniques and relatability to variety of personalities in students and coworkers.
- Experience working in the mental health field or other social services.
- Proficient in learning management systems or related platforms for digital training use.
- Ability to travel extensively throughout Sacramento County and throughout California if necessary.
- Have a Class C driver's license and clean driving record.
- Proof of valid automobile insurance and ability to be insured by MHAC's liability insurance.
- Must provide proof of auto liability insurance policy upon the first day of employment, maintain required coverage amounts and provide ongoing documentation of continuous coverage.
- All employees will drive personal vehicles as part of job functions.
- Proficient in Microsoft Word, Excel, Teams, and Outlook. MS Access and PowerPoint highly required.
